1. Program Introduction

1.1 Brief Introduction:

Degree Education Programs sponsored by the Ministry of Commerce of People's Republic of China is designed to foster high-end business officials and managerial personnel for the recipient countries, offering one-year and two-year master programs as well as three-year doctoral programs for the purpose of educating high-end and inter-disciplinary talent working in the applied fields of government, trade, foreign affairs, agriculture, technology, education, culture and health, building intellectual capacity and facilitating the economic and social development of the recipient countries. These programs provide assistance to governmental officials, research fellows, and senior managerial personnel on their master and doctor education in China, which are fully conducted in English. Admission requirements include a bachelor's degree, relevant working experiences, and decent physical conditions, essential for the high-compact curriculum needed for the degrees. The programs are playing a more and more important role in stimulating economic cooperation between China and students' home countries, which the host governments are attaching great attention to this program.

The master program in Information and Communication Engineering, undertaken by the School of Electronic Information and Communications (EIC), Huazhong University of Science and Technology (HUST), will not only accelerate the process of informatization and serve as a propeller for the informatization and infrastructure of developing countries, but also provide a platform to connect developing countries and China. It is bound to lay a solid foundation for cooperation and friendship among different countries.

1.2 Prospective Students:

Our prospective students are mid-to-senior level officials, university professors, and business management personnel who are engaged in research and system management related to information and communication industry, demonstrate superior performance both academically and practically.

1.3 Program Objective:

To prepare high-caliber and interdisciplinary talents in the field of information and communication.

1.4 Enrollment Plan:

In 2024, HUST plans to enroll up to 45 students in this master's program. This master's program is a two-year program. The language of instruction is English. Students should comply with Chinese laws and the university's regulation and requirements during study.

1.5 Financial Aid:

- a) Students are exempt from tuition fee, teaching material fee, research and survey fee, allowance of English-taught program, dissertation guidance fee;
- b) Free on-campus accommodation;
- c) Monthly stipend: 36000RMB per year per master student;
- d) One-off resettlement fee: 3000RMB per person;
- e) Free medical insurance for international students;
- f) One-time round-trip international airfare for all the students (First time fly to China after enrollment, and Fly back to home country while graduation), and one-time round-trip international airfares for home visits;
- g) The annual review is compulsory for all students. Those who pass the review may continue to enjoy full scholarships in the next year;
- h) Other expenses shall be managed and used by the Ministry of Commerce or the universities as a whole, and shall not be distributed to students. The Ministry of Commerce only provides students with financial assistance within their enrolled academic duration. Students who postpone their graduation will not receive the continuing sponsorship.

2. University Introduction

2.1 Huazhong University of Science and Technology:

Huazhong University of Science and Technology (HUST) is a comprehensive research university located in Wuhan, China under the direct supervision of the Ministry of Education. It is a participant university of the former "985" Project in China, and also one of the first universities approved under the national "Double First-Class" Initiative, China's "Excellence Initiative" for institutions of higher education.

HUST has consistently ranked among the top 10 universities in China in the major domestic and international rankings, including the Shanghai Ranking's Academic Ranking of World Universities and US News and World Report Best Global Universities Ranking.

HUST is comprised of its main campus close by picturesque East Lake and a satellite medical campus located in the central business district of Hankou across the Yangtze River. Today the university has more than 3,400 full-time teachers, including over 1,200 professors, serving approximately 55,000 full-time students. Complementing this rich academic environment is HUST's remarkable greenscape – covering 72% of the campus, its rich canopy of trees explains why many people now refer to it as the "university in the forest."

HUST boasts a full range of academic disciplines, comprising 10 major categories that range from engineering and medicine --HUST's two most notable pillars of strength – to its fast-growing science and distinctive liberal arts disciplines. Guided by its sense of mission to contribute to social progress and the greater global community, the university continues to explore the frontiers of science, and is the only university in China that includes four national research facilities. International cooperation also lies at the core of HUST development strategy.

2.2 School of Electronic Information and Communications:

The School of Electronic Information and Communications (EIC) was founded in 1960 as the Department of Radio Engineering of Huazhong Institute of Technology, and was later renamed the Department of Electronics and Information Engineering of the former Huazhong University of Science and Technology. After the merger in May 2000, it

became the Department of Electronics and Information Engineering of Huazhong University of Science and Technology (HUST). In November 2014, it was changed to the present name, School of Electronic Information and Communications. EIC possesses great strength in teaching and scientific research, boasting two first-level disciplines (Information and Communication Engineering and Electronic Science and Technology) and postdoctoral research stations with the same names. EIC is among the first group approved to confer doctoral degrees. It is qualified to confer doctoral and master's degrees in Communication and Information System, Signal and Information Processing, Circuits and Systems, and Electromagnetic Field and Microwave. Communication and Information System, the second-level discipline, is a national key fostering discipline. Information and Communication Engineering and Electronic Science and Technology are both the first-level key disciplines in Hubei Province.

There are 158 faculty members in EIC. Of them, there are 117 full-time teachers, including 37 professors and 56 associate professors. A number of famous scholars in China and abroad were invited by EIC as part-time professors or consultant professors, including Zhu Zhongliang, academician of Chinese Academy of Sciences, Zhong Shan and Zhao Zisen, both are academicians of Chinese Academy of Engineering, and Professor Zhang Kezhao from Iowa State University.

International collaboration programs and international student education are also the highlights of EIC education. EIC works in collaboration with the University of Birmingham of the United Kingdom, the Arizona State University of the U.S. and the University of Wollongong of Australia to co-establish China-Britain class, China-US class, China-Australia class, etc (with varying academic-year lengths, such as 2+2, 3+1). Two universities cultivate students jointly, and credits are recognized by two universities. In the national first-level discipline ranking of 2012, the index of "student international exchange" of EIC ranked first. In addition, EIC is the first school in HUST to set up undergraduate, graduate and doctoral programs for international students, in which all classes are taught in English. So far, EIC has cultivated more than 1000 international

students.

EIC has also established good training cooperation with many domestic and international communication and IT enterprises, which has gathered rich training resources for the high-quality implementation of the education programs.

2.3 Campus Life:

HUST is located in Wuhan, the capital of Hubei Province. Wuhan is a subtropical monsoonal humid climate area with abundant rainfall and sufficient sunshine, it has four distinct seasons in mid-latitudes zone. Wuhan is in the middle of P. R. China with convenient transportation and reasonable price level, and it is also one of the ideal livable cities in China. It has convenient living conditions with high-level facilities. A variety of sports stadiums, libraries, supermarkets, banks, school clinics and other supporting facilities are fully equipped to meet the daily learning and living needs of students.

HUST provides single room equipped with washing room, air-condition, network for students in this program. There are more than 200 single rooms available for international students. The university has 35 student canteens, including several halal canteens. After years of undertaking foreign-aid training programs, HUST has formed a complete teaching and living service support system through the integration of social resources, which can also provide various aspects of support to this foreign-aid master training program.

3. Education Plan

3.1 Course Arrangement

The training on skills of scientific research runs through the whole program. Scientific research is started when students enter school, along with courses study and project practice.

The Master program is Credit based. The program requires a total of minimum of 39 credits, which include a minimum of 24 credits for degree courses and 15 research credits.

The list of the compulsory courses, elective courses, semester, and credits for each course are shown in Table.

3.1.1 General Courses (≥7 credits)

Chinese Language	This course aims to cultivate students' basic knowledge and skills of Chinese. Based on the text in the textbook, explain the relevant vocabulary, sentence pattern and grammatical structure; carry out oral and written exercises, and carry out writing exercises appropriately.	4

3.1.2 Compulsory Courses (≥17 credits)

Electronic Commerce	This course will introduce the basic concepts of electronic commerce to students, help them knowing about its developing history in China and worldwide, grasping the scientific ways of analyzing electronic commerce's business model, and fostering the students' ability to analyzing examples. Furthermore, we will set specific and hierarchical experiments which will enable them to construct basic cognition about the key technology of electronic commerce's application domain. In the end, the course will foster their innovation thinking, encouraging them to think independently, analyze independently, and innovate independently. The experiments are as follows: a) The concepts and development history of electronic commerce. b) Example analyzing of Alibaba c) Example analyzing of Amazon. d) Business models e) Documentary discussing of The Internet Age	2
IT Project Management	In this course, the students will be guided to complete an IT project to help understand the whole process of IT project management from start to the end, including the principle of the project life cycle, the team establishment and management, quality management, incentive theory, and some solutions to cost and time estimation, risk assessment, conflict resolution and some other specific issues. Finally, the students are required to master the practical experience of avoiding the problems happened in the project and the ability of project management.	2
Artificial Intelligence	Overview of artificial intelligence; basic motivations, core ideas, classical algorithms, and representative applications of topics such as scheme search, unsupervised learning, knowledge engineering;	2

This course covers the overview of various kinds of academic literature, basic elements of technical paper, design of title, survey of the related literature, citation rules, expression of experiment results, writing rules of graduate thesis, and etc. This course will be helpful to improve the student ability in academic writing, which will further support his technical him to submit technical paper and degree thesis.

After course learning, students should know the recent development of wireless communications and networking technologies, and grasp the principles of wireless communication networks, including the fading characteristics of wireless channels, how to use diversity techniques to combat the channel fading, and multiple-access techniques. Moreover, students will get to know about the evolution and key techniques of two representative wireless communication systems, mobile cellular networks and Wi-Fi networks, the recent development, and future trends and application fields next-generation mobile communication systems. With these fundamentals, the students are expected to have a big picture of the wireless communication systems and gain vision on the development of future 5G/6G systems.

3.2 Teaching Methods

Classes will incorporate a mix of lectures, seminars, case discussions, practice training, and on-spot study.

3.3 Semester Arrangement

Beside the course study, students should enter the research stage as early as possible after enrollment, review the literature under the guidance of the supervisor, write the literature review report, study the topic and select the topic of the dissertation.

3.4 Dissertation

- a) The innovative achievements used for the application of master's degree should be completed independently by the degree candidate, during his/her degree studies. The dissertation is the main criteria for the degree evaluation.
- b) The topic of the dissertation should be a basic or applied research topic in the relevant research direction of the discipline, with great theoretical significance or application value, and with important academic significance or application value for the development of the discipline or the national demand.
- c) The content of the dissertation shall reflect that the applicant has solid basic theories and systematic expertise in the discipline of information and communication engineering, and has extensive understanding of the frontier dynamics and development trend of the research field. The dissertation should have the author's own creative thinking and the main research results should be innovative.
- d) The thesis should be systematic and complete, with clear expression, rigorous argumentation, accurate and comprehensive citations. The thesis should follow the academic writing format and rules.
- e) Master students can present their innovative achievements in the forms of journal papers, conference papers, monographs, patents, software copyrights, patents, and other forms (hereinafter collectively referred to as relevant academic achievements). The relevant academic achievements can be used as an important reference to evaluate the thesis level.

3.5 Confer Degree

For the candidate who has completed this program and passed the degree defense, if his application is checked and approved by the school committee of academic degree, he will be allowed for graduation. For the candidate who has satisfied the requirement of master's degree, if his application is checked and approved by the Academic Degree Evaluation Committee of the university, he will be awarded the master's degree.

4. Application Procedures

4.1 Eligibility:

To be eligible, applicants must:

- a) Be in compliance with the laws and regulations of the People's Republic of China (PRC) and the university regulations, and respect Chinese customs and habits;
- b) Be a citizen of a developing country other than the People's Republic of China, and under the age of 45 (born after September 1, 1978);
- c) Be healthy physically and mentally with a physical examination report issued by a local public hospital, and not having any disease or situation listed below: Diseases prohibited by Chinese Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Laws and Regulations; Other severe chronic diseases like high blood pressure, cardio-cerebrovascular disease, diabetes; psychological diseases; or other infectious diseases which may harm public health; In recovery period after major surgery or acute disease attacks; Severe physically challenged; Pregnancy;
- d) With at least three years' working experience, and be a bachelor's degree holder when applying for this program;
- e) Be sufficient in English skill to meet the academic requirements of the program, be equivalent to IELTS 6.0 or TOEFL 80 and above level;
- f) Be with the potential of professional development, and is committed to promoting the friendly exchanges and cooperation between the host country and China;
- g) Be neither studying in China nor being admitted to other scholarship programs provided by Chinese government.
- h) Only applicants recommended by the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Office of Chinese Embassy in the country that accords with the candidate's nationality will be considered.

4.2 Application Online:

4.2.1 Application to HUST

Please visit the online application system of HUST at (http://admission.hust.edu.cn), and register for an account. Fill in all the required information and upload all the required documents and submit your application. After your application is completed, you will have an application number (11 digits) like "202XXXXXXXXX", please print this HUST application form for submission. **Please note the following information:**

- a) Type of Programs: Master Programs;
- b) Program: Information and Communication Engineering (MPA);
- c) Department: School of Electronic Information and Communications.

4.3 Application Documents (written in Chinese or English):

- a) Recommendation letter from current employer: It should be issued by the department where the applicant is working in. It should cover the basic information of the applicants and the intension to recommend the applicant.
- b) Recommendation letter from academic perspective: It should be issued by vice professors or professors. It should cover the academic background, research field, past achievements and research ability of the applicant.
- c) Highest diploma: Graduation and Degree Certificates must be originals or the notarized copies, in Chinese or English; If the applicant has not graduated yet, he or she should provide a letter issued by the school to state the graduation date.
- d) Academic transcripts: Official transcripts must be originals or notarized copies in Chinese or English; Transcripts must cover all the courses studied and final standards achieved.
- e) CV: Written in English. It should cover the personal background information and the applicant's experience of study and work after the high school.

- f) Personal statement: Written in English. It should cover the applicant's ideas and objectives for studying the major applied.
- g) A Study Plan or Research Proposal: Written in English; It should cover the applicant's learning and research tasks that he/she wishes to accomplish during their study in China.
- h) Passport: The passport must be valid; Do not use the Diplomatic passport or Service passport; The passport used to apply must be the same with passport used for entry into China and registration in HUST.
- i) English proficiency: Non-native English speakers or those who did not participate English-taught Bachelor Program should submit English proficiency certificate like TOEFL, IELTS etc.
- j) Photos: 2 photos (the last 3 months) in passport photo size; White background and bareheaded;
- k) Physical Examination Form: The health form shall be issued within one month before the submission of application, showing that the applicant carries no infectious diseases which may have a serious impact on public health or fall into any of the health situations prohibited by China's Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Laws and Regulations.
- 1) Non- criminal record report: The applicant shall submit a valid certificate of Non-Criminal Record issued by the local public security authority, usually issued within 6 months prior to the submission date of the application.

4.4 Submission Offline:

- a) The applicants shall obtain the approval and recommendation from the relevant department of host country before applying for this scholarship. Afterwards, the applicants could submit application according to the requirements of above department.
- b) For the applicants whose host government allows them to submit the application directly to the Embassy of China, please obtain the permission or recommendation letter from the host government which states that the applicant has been approved to study in

China, and submit the original documents of the letter and other above mentioned application documents to the ECCO of Chinese Embassy in the host country. The scanned electronic edition of the documents is needed as well. For emails and addresses of the Economic and Commercial Counsellor's Offices, please visit http://www.china-aibo.cn.

- c) The responsible department of the host government shall submit a written request to the ECCO of Chinese Embassy for an official recommendation letter and clearly state:
 - Whether the applicant is willing to be considered for a similar program at other universities if the applied programs could not accept the applicant.
 - Other special requests if any.

Important Reminders:

- a) All the documents to be submitted should be in Chinese or English. Otherwise, a notarized copy in Chinese or English is required.
- b) An original copy of degrees, transcripts, Foreigner Physical Examination Form and language certificates must be presented for on-site verification.
- c) Applicants will get back all the hard-copy materials, both original copies and photocopies from the ECCO of Chinese Embassy. If admitted, students must take the documents to China and submit them to HUST.

I. Program Description

1. Overview

Founded in 2008, Academic Education Programs sponsored by the Ministry of Commerce of People's Republic of China is designed to foster high-end business officials and managerial personnel for developing countries, offering one-year and two-year master programs as well as three-year doctoral programs for the purpose of educating high-end and inter-disciplinary talent working in the applied fields of government, trade, foreign affairs, agriculture, technology, education, culture and health, building intellectual capacity and facilitating the economic and social development of developing countries. These programs provide assistance to governmental officials, research fellows, and senior managerial personnel on their master and doctoral education in China, which are fully conducted in English. Admission requirements include a bachelor's degree, relevant working experiences, and decent physical conditions, essential for the high-compact curriculum needed for the degrees.

These programs attract governmental attention of program graduates' home countries, playing an increasingly important role in the economic development cooperation between China and their home countries.

Master Program of Public Diplomacy at Jilin University aims at providing students with basic theory and research methods of public

diplomacy, international relations, diplomacy studies, public relations, communication studies, familiarizing them with public diplomacy developments of different countries and developing their capacities both in practice and theory suitable for government, society and entrepreneurial environments.

About Jilin University

Founded in 1946, Jilin University has been merged with the former Jilin University of Technology, Norman Bethune Medical University, Changchun University of Science and Technology, and Changchun College of Posts and Communications in 2000; and with the former University of Military Logistics in 2004; As one of the key research-oriented comprehensive universities directly under the Ministry of Education, Jilin University is strongly supported by state key projects such as "211" and "985", and is the largest comprehensive university in China in terms of its student enrolment. Jilin Province is located in the central part of Northeast China, its territory covers 187,400 square kilometers, and the population is over 23 million, with Changchun City as its capital. Jilin province is one of China's important production base of commodity grains including corn and soybean etc. The petrol-chemistry and automobile industry is fairly developed. Jilin Province has special landscape with good ecological environment, rich natural, mineral and tourist resources. After these years' development and construction, there are more than 300 tourist spot in Jilin Province, and a new travel system has been formed including Changbai Mountains Nature

Reserve, Jingyue Pool National Forest Park, Jilin Songhua Lake National Scenic Resort, Beida Lake Skiing field, moreover, The Xianghai Nature Reserve of Tongyu in the west area has been place on the catalogue in the world most important wetland. The Konguryo's ruins, tombs, of the General and the King at Ji'an City, Jilin Province were listed in the World Famous Heritage List by the 28th Conference of the World Heritage Committee on July 1st, 2004. In December 2021, a newly built ice&snow-themed park with high-standard has been opened grandly in Changchun City, namely Changchun Automobile Ice and Snow Carnival. On the opening day of the carnival, to celebrate the coming New Year, as well as the Spring Festival and the Lantern Festival, a splendid firework show lasted for twenty minutes was greatly enjoyed by visitors. The show symbolizes the spirit of the Olympics, which will encourage visitors' emotions of embrace Winter Olympics.

Changchun is a beautiful modern city located to the northeast of Beijing, in the heart of the Northeast China Plain. Its urban population is now about 9 million. Lying in the temperate zone, Changchun is neither too hot nor too cold with four distinct seasons and an annual average temperature of $5.2^{\circ}\text{C}_{\circ}$

Jingyue Tan (Crystal Moon Lake) to the southeast of the city is known for its largest artificial forest area in Asia and a national resort with perfect ecological environment. Puyi, the last emperor of the Qing Dynasty built his palace in Changchun.

About School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA)

The Era of Public Diplomacy calls for new type of talents who are versed in communication and dialogue, and have good knowledge of the world economy, politics and cultural plurality. As an answer to this calling and to promote public diplomacy and cultural exchanges, Jilin University has set up School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) which is the first school oriented in public diplomacy studies among Chinese universities. In 2014 SIPA participated as a founding member in the establishment of "Collaborative Innovation Center of the Theory and Practices of China's Diplomacy" initiated by China Foreign Affairs University.

School of International and Public Affairs has being undertaken the English conducted graduate program on 'Contemporary International Relations Studies' since 2006, and has constructed a faculty team pivoted in International Relations while specialized in International Relations, Public Diplomacy, Environmental Governance, International Law, etc. SIPA also includes Barry Buzan who is member of British Academy of Science and a former professor of London School of Economics, Brantly Womack who is the Friendship Award recipient and professor of government and diplomacy in the University of Virginia, etc. as Honorary or Guest Professors.

SIPA combines the training of Chinese students and International students together and adopted English as the working language for main courses. The purpose is to lay out a multicultural platform, promote research in public diplomacy, China studies and international relations, and cultivate a

new generation of herald of civility and specialist in communication.

SIPA will steadily uphold the educational ideal of internationalization, inclusiveness, innovation and practice, and will put greater endeavor for the development of public diplomacy disciplines in China.

2. Prospective Students

This program opens to government officials from developing countries and mid-level or above management officials from universities, research institutes, NGO, medias and so on. Applicants should hold Bachelor or above certificate, under the age of 45. Priorities will be given to applicants who have working experiences and leadership decision experiences.

3. Program Objective

Approved by Academic Degree Office of the State Council and initiated by Ministry of Commerce of China, SIPA has undertaken the "Master Program of Public Diplomacy for Senior Officials in Developing Countries" since 2014, which recruit about 20 students per year for those who are officials working in Media, Culture, Education and Public Diplomacy sectors in developing countries.

4. Enrollment Plan

In 2024 we plan to enroll 20 students in this master program. All courses will be taught in English, students are required to finish their study within

one year, acquire enough credits, finish thesis wring and then be granted a Law Master Degree. The total credits required is 20.

5. Financial Support

- (1) Fees of tuition, teaching and study materials, study trips, English-taught program subsidy and thesis supervision are exempted.
 - (2) Accommodation is arranged by the host university for free.
- (3) Students will get living allowance by month: 36000 RMB/year for the master program, and 42000 RMB/year for the doctoral program.
- (4) Students will get one-time settlement allowance of 3000 RMB/person for only once.
 - (5) The host university will purchase insurance for students.
- (6) Students will be offered with free round-trip international air tickets. For the one-year program, only one round-trip international flights will be offered. For the two-year and above program, n-1(n represents the number of academic years) round-trip international air tickets will be offered.
- (7) Other sponsored expenses are used as a whole by the Ministry of Commerce or the host university and not granted to admitted students. The financial support is subjected to the length of the program. Those who postpone graduation will not get continued financial support.

6. Living Condition

Lying in the temperate zone, Changchun is neither too hot nor too cold with four distinct seasons and an annual average temperature of 5.2° C. The highest temperature in summer remains around 28° C while the lowest temperature in winter remains around -25° C. The consumer price level in Changchun reaches the middle level among all Chinese Provincial capitals.

There are two international student dormitory buildings for students to choose: Friendship Guesthouse and Hexie Jiayuan. The detailed dormitory information is as follows.

3. Education Model

Regular courses are the majority of this program, together with scheduled seminars, reports and presentations. Besides instructors listed above, SIPA also invites famous scholars and diplomats around the world come to Jilin University to give lectures, in order to broaden students' horizon and set up their connections with them.

As supplements to Classroom courses, field studies are arranged regularly. In first semester, trips to other cities are arranged; and in the second semester, students could go to visit Northeast China countryside and nearby cities.

4. Time Schedule

First Semester:

September–Late October: first stage classroom courses, supervisor-student matching-up.

Early November: field study trip to other cities, etc.

Middle November- Late December: second stage classroom courses

Mid to Late December: thesis proposal defense

January-Late February: thesis writing, mid-term evaluation

Second Semester:

Late February-Early May: thesis writing, plagiarism-checking, thesis revision and external review

Late April: Field study

Late May: thesis defense

Late June-Early July: graduation

5. Master Thesis

Students are expected to fix specific research topic by the end of first semester, and have thesis dissertation. School of International and Public Affairs will be responsible for thesis writing supervision. The thesis topic should focus on public diplomacy. The thesis is expected to combine theoretical perspectives, analytical skills and practical experiences of public diplomacy, and aiming at solving practical problem, no less than 12 thousand

words.

6. Degree Requirements

Students are required to successfully complete 20 credit-worth course work and a master thesis and thesis defense within the required time period. After meeting the above requirements and with the approval of University Degree Committee, the master degree of International Studies in Law will be awarded. The main body of graduation thesis shall consist of at least 40 pages.

III. Application

1. Application Prerequisites

- (1) Applicants must be non-Chinese citizens from developing countries with good health condition under the age of 45 (born after September 1, 1979);
- (2) Applicants must be physically and psychologically healthy, and are required to provide physical examination result issued by the local public hospital to certify that they do not have: a) Diseases prohibited by Chinese Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Laws and Regulations b) Other severe chronic diseases including high blood pressure, cardio-cerebrovascular disease, diabetes, cancers and etc.; psychological diseases; or other infectious

diseases which may harm public health c) been in the recovery period of major operations; or in the attack stage of acute diseases d) severe disability e) pregnancy. Admitted applicants will be dropped out once pregnant during the period of studying in China.

- (3) Applicants must have attained a Bachelor's degree or above, and minimum three-year working experience;
- (4) Applicants who have educational or ongoing working experience related to the applying program will be preferentially considered.
- (5) Applicants should be public servants at the rank of section chief or above in the government, senior management staff in the institutions and enterprises, and academic mainstay in the colleges and research institutions.
- (6) Applicants should have a good command of English and be able to follow the English-taught courses (Required standards: IELTS 6.0+ or TOFEL 80+)
- (7) Applicants should have career potential and be dedicated to promote friendly exchange and cooperation between China and their home countries.
- (8) Applicants who are studying in China or have been admitted by other Chinese Government Scholarship programs when applying will not be accepted.

2. Application Procedure

3. Application Materials

- (1) Working Institution Recommendation Letter. The letter is issued by the applicant's working institution to introduce the applicant's basic information while stating its willingness to recommend the applicant to study in China.
- (2) Academic Recommendation Letter. The letter is issued by person who has associate professorship or above to introduce the applicant's academic background, major, performance and research ability.
 - (3) Highest-level diploma.

- (4) Transcripts of the highest diploma.
- (5) Personal Statement.
- (6) Study Plan.
- (7) Photocopy of passport. Please do not submit diplomatic or business passport.
- (8) Language Certificate (only for non-English speaking applicants, IELTS or TOFEL)
 - (9) Photocopies of Foreigner Physical Examination Form.

4. Submission

- (1) The applicant needs to get permission and recommendation from the governmental authority concerned in his/her home country before applying for this program, and to submit application documents in accordance with the detailed regulations of the authority.
- (2) In the country that the governmental authority concerned allows the applicant to submit application documents to the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Office of Chinese Embassy directly, the applicant needs to submit a certificate or recommendation letter which certifies the authority's permission together with original copies and scanned photocopies of the required application documents stated in the above 2 and 3.
- (3) The governmental authority concerned in the applicant's home country submit a written request to the Economic and Commercial

Counselor's Office of Chinese Embassy for an official recommendation letter for the applicant and clearly state:

- a) Whether the applicant is willing to be considered for a similar program at other universities if the programs at Jilin University are already full.
- b) Other special requests if any.

5. Reminders

- (1) All the documents to be submitted should be in Chinese or English.

 Otherwise, a notarized copy in Chinese or English is required.
- (2) An original copy of degrees, transcripts and language certificates must be presented for on-site verification. After that, candidates should scan all the materials and email them to the liaison of Jilin University.
- (3) Applicants will get back all the hard-copy materials, both original copies and photocopies from the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Office. If admitted, they must take the documents to China and submit them for verification during registration at Jilin university.
- (4) None of the materials submitted to Jilin University will be returned. For important documents such as degrees and transcripts, a stamped copy issued by the institution where the applicant received his/her degrees will be accepted as a replacement of the original copy. In this case, the original copy must be presented for on-site verification.

6. Deadline

The application deadline for the master program is June 7th, 2024.

7. Important Notes

(1) Applicants shall complete online applying on JLU and CSC

systems before deadline.

(2) All documents will not be returned to applicants whether they are

enrolled or not;

(3) Chinese government will not give any comments or explanation to

applicants whether they are enrolled or not;

(4) Admitted applicants are not allowed to bring spouse and children

to China as study companion. The scholarship does not cover any expenses

caused by the applicant's spouse's and children's visit to them.

(5) More detailed information concerning on visa application and

other requirements would be listed in the admission document.

I Program Description

1. Basic Information

(1) Introduction

Academic Education Program for developing countries under the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China (MOFCOM) was established in 2008 by MOFCOM through Chinese Government Programs. The purpose of this program is to cultivate high-end, inter-disciplinary and applied talents for the recipient countries in such fields as politics, trade, foreign affairs, agriculture, technology, education, culture and health, energy and transportation, public management, etc., and to provide intellectual support for recipient countries in their economic and social developments. The Academic Education Program offers one-year or two-year master programs and 3-year doctoral programs, which provide assistance to government officials, research fellows, and senior managerial personnel on their master and doctoral education in China, and are instructed in English. Due to short schooling system, the students are requested to obtain a bachelor degree in advance with some working experience in related fields so that they can better understand the lectures. They are also requested to be in a good health so as to adapt to extensive learning and to obtain the degrees.

This program is playing an increasingly important role in the economic and trade cooperation and development between China and the recipient countries and highly valued by the respective governments.

2024 International Program for Master of International Business (IMIB) organized by Jiangxi University of Finance and Economics (JUFE) for Senior Officials of Developing Countries prepares you for leadership positions in the field of international business with a curriculum designed and delivered by China's first-level faculty, to help you meet the unique challenges of managing teams that span continents and cultures and expanding businesses into new global markets, in a vibrant learning environment.

(2) Prospective Students

Our prospective students are mid-to-senior level officials or managers from the government agencies, foreign-related enterprises, colleges, academic institutions and other public sectors, who have demonstrated superior performance, both academically and in their work. By the time of enrollment, each must have obtained an undergraduate bachelor's degree.

(3) Program Objective

To train high-level, compound and applied talents in the fields of politics, economy and trade, diplomacy, agriculture, science, education, culture and health, energy and transportation, public administration, etc. for developing countries.

(4) Enrollment Plan

We plan to enroll up to 30 students for our 2024 International Program for Master of International Business (IMIB) with two years of full-time schooling and English is the language of instruction.

(5) Financial Aid

The program is funded by the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China under the foreign aid fund, which includes the expenses of training school and its administration fees as well as students living expenses and round-trip international airfare. Students are exempt from tuition fees, textbook materials, field trip fees, English tuition fees, and thesis supervision fees. The school provides free accommodation for the students and purchase comprehensive medical insurance on their behalf. It also provides students with a regular living allowance of RMB36000 per year for Master students, and RMB 42000 for PHD students with settlement fees of RMB 3000 for both types of students. The Ministry of Commerce offers free round-trip international air tickets: those with one-year program can enjoy one round-trip international air ticket; those with two or more than two-year program can enjoy one round-trip international air ticket, and also can enjoy round-trip air tickets for n-1 (n for school year) home visits. All degree students are required to participate in the annual assessment. Successful applicants will be eligible for full scholarship for the following year. Other fees like the teaching materials expenses shall be managed by the Ministry of Commerce or JUFE as planned, and shall not be given to the students. The students are funded within 2-year study period. Those who postpone

their graduation cannot get further funding.

2. About the Organizer

(1) About JUFE

Jiangxi University of Finance and Economics (JUFE), founded in 1923, is located in Nanchang city, Jiangxi province, China. It is jointly governed and sponsored by the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Education and the People's Government of Jiangxi Province. As a comprehensive institution of higher learning with a focus on economics and management, JUFE is one of the leading universities in these areas, ranking 7th among all the universities of Finance and Economics in China. JUFE also includes significant disciplines in languages, international education, humanity, law, engineering, natural science, agriculture, philosophy and history. The university has a current teaching staff of 1294, including 257 professors, 444 associate professors, 124 doctoral supervisors and 642 master advisors. Two of them are awarded National Teaching Excellence Award, 27 are granted Special Government Allowances of the State Council, 2 are listed as National Model Teachers, 2 are listed in the National "One-hundred, One-thousand, Ten-thousand Talent Project", and 4 are included in the Ministry of Education's "New Century Excellent Talents Support Project". In the 4th round of national disciplinary evaluation, JUFE is ranked A- in applied economics (top 10% in China), and chosen as the first-class discipline construction in Jiangxi.

JUFE has 21 teaching colleges, with 26,000 full-time undergraduates, nearly 5,000 postgraduate students and over 600 international students. The university has established and cooperated with 141 universities in 40 countries and regions, including the United States, the United Kingdom, Canada and Australia.

(2) About SITE

This program will be organized by School of International Trade and Economics (SITE) of JUFE. SITE founded in 1958, is specialized in education and research in international economics and business. The SITE has a current teaching staff of 63, including 10 professors and 25 associate professors. Cooperating with 12 excellent universities of USA, UK, Japan, South Korea and Australia, SITE is outstanding in overseas education. Since 2008, more than 900 senior officials from 90 developing countries have been trained by SITE.

(3) Living Environment and Condition

JUFE is located in Nanchang, Jiangxi, which is not only a historical cultural city but also a revolutionary heroic city in China with total areas of 7402 squire kilometers and population of 6.56 million (in 2023). The price level in Nanchang is low with average monthly consumption around 2000-3000 Yuan. Nanchang is a typical city of "hot summer and cold winter". It is hot in summer but cold in winter. Nanchang is known as one of the four "furnaces" in China with the highest temperature at $40\,^{\circ}\mathrm{C}$. The lowest temperature in winter in the past few years reached -6 $^{\circ}\mathrm{C}$. Therefore, students should prepare T-shirts and heavy coats for themselves.

JUFE has constructed International Student Apartment within the campus. Each international student of master program or PhD program is provided with a standard independent apartment. The apartment has a complete set of equipment, such as an air-conditioner, a TV set, a water heater, a wardrobe, a low cabinet, a single bed, etc..The apartment also is equipped with public kitchens, which facilitate students in their life.

3. Education Plan

(1) Program Structure

This program structure includes three parts, such as classroom learning, business and social survey, and the academic thesis. The minimum credits require 38 credits as follows:

★ Profiles of Faculty

Jiangxi University of Finance and Economics will provide high-quality faculty for this project. All teaching staff have overseas educational backgrounds and abundant practical experience, and have been engaged in international business teaching and research for a long time.

(3) Teaching Methods

The language of instruction is English. Classes will incorporate a mix of lectures, seminars, case discussions, tutorials, presentations and so on. As for Business and Social Survey, Field trips will be arranged for students to visit the relevant business corporations, large-scale commodity trading markets, the representative commercial centers to gain first-hand knowledge of how governments and markets operate under various changing conditions in the reform and opening-up process of China, each time the relevant survey research report shall be submitted.

(4) Semesters

The program comprises of 4 semesters. The first semester begins in September 2024 and the last semester ended before the end of July 2026. Students will have two winter

vacations and one summer vacation in 2 academic years.

(5) Thesis

★ Thesis Requirement

Students are expected to bring specific research questions concerning international business management and multinational strategy to the program, as a part of thesis research preparation. In the first semester, students can choose their thesis supervisors. The type of thesis consists of academic research papers, project research report and case analysis report. The thesis is expected to combine theoretical perspectives, analytical skills and practical experiences of international business, and aiming at solving practical problems. Students must pass oral defense for the thesis.

★ Thesis Defense Requirement

A student is permitted to apply for thesis defense if he/she has received the approval with signature from his/her supervisor.

(6) Degree Requirement

After completing all credits within the prescribed time, passing the HSK Level 3 Chinese proficiency test, completing the thesis and passing the defense, and being reviewed and approved by the Degree Evaluation Committee of Jiangxi University of Finance and Economics, the Master's degree in International Business is awarded by Jiangxi University of Finance and Economics.

II Application

1. Application Prerequisites

- (1) Applicants must be non-Chinese citizen from developing countries, who should be in good health not exceeding 45 years of age (born after 1 September 1979);
- (2) All applicants shall be in good physical and mental health with health certificates and physical examination forms issued by local public hospitals without any diseases that prohibited to enter China or to stay in China for long-term residence by Chinese laws and regulations. They should have no serious chronic diseases, such as hypertension, cardiovascular and cerebrovascular diseases, diabetes, cancer or other serious mental diseases, or infectious diseases that may cause serious harm to

public health, major surgical recovery period, acute disease onset period, and severe disability of limbs. Pregnant women are not allowed to study in China. If they become pregnant during their studies in China, they will be expelled out of school.

- (3) Applicants must have attained a Bachelor Degree or above with three or more than three years working experience.
- (4) Applicants whose professional knowledge or work experience are related to the program offered can enjoy priority of admission.
- (5) Applicants who are government officials with the rank of section chief or above (or correspondent rank), senior managers in various institutions or enterprises, or academic backbones of universities and research institutions can also enjoy priority of admission.
- (6) Applicants should be good at English and able to use English for professional studies with IELTS scoring 6.0 or above, or New TOEFL scoring 80 or above.
- (7) Applicant should have the potential for his career development in his fields with an effort to promote the exchange and cooperation between the host country and China.
- (8) Applicants who have studied in China or have been admitted to other Chinese government scholarship programs are not allowed to apply.

2. Application Procedure

(1) Online Application

I Program Description

1. Basic Information

(1) Brief Introduction

The Diploma & Degree Education Aid Program of P.R.C. for Developing Countries, founded in 2008 upon the China's Foreign Aid Fund, is under the management of the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China for the purpose of training and cultivating high-end financial and commercial officials and administrative talents. The program is specially designed with three academic levels including one-year master degree, two-year master degree and three-year doctoral degree to support the aided countries intellectually by cultivating high-level, inter-disciplinary and application-oriented talents in politics, commercial trade, diplomacy, agriculture, science, education, literature, health, energy, transportation and public administration for them.

Highly valued by their governments, these students are playing an increasingly important role in the economic and trading cooperation and development between their mother countries and China.

The "Master of Public Health 2024" sponsored by the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China, is a two-year English degree curriculum program under the administration of the Southern Medical University. The program is designed for professional personnel of different backgrounds, who are expected to improve the medical care systems and national public health situations of their countries. Aiming to cultivate high-level application-oriented talents in the health administration and disease prevention fields, it deepens the students' understanding of Chinese public health development practice. In response to the demand of developing countries for the cultivation of senior public health talents, the 2024 program will recruit students in two directions: public health science division and public health management division.

(2) Prospective Students

The prospective students are administrative personnel and professional public health talents from public health departments of developing countries, including health administrative departments, hospitals, disease control centers, community health organizations and inspection & quarantine organizations, or those engaged in public health. They should have demonstrated superior performance in their work and sufficient English proficiency to conduct their study. By the time of matriculation, each must be under 45 years of age and have a bachelor's degree.

(3) Program Objective

To cultivate high level application-oriented talents for developing countries who meet the needs of the development of global public health with theoretical knowledge and technical ability of public health, medical and health administration ability, and the ability to solve the actual public health problems in their host country.

(4) Enrollment Plan

In 2024 we have planned to enroll up to 40 students in Master of Public Health (MPH) Program which will be offered fully in English and last for two years.

(5) Funding Contents

With the foreign aid fund, this program provides funds for expenses relevant to teaching and administration as well as students' basic living expenses and round-trip tickets, including:

- (a) Tuition fees, teaching materials and textbooks, investigation and inspection, English teaching subsidy and graduate thesis tutoring expense;
- (b) Accommodation;
- (c) Regular allowance: 36,000 Yuan per person per year for master degree candidate;
- (d) One-time settlement allowance 3,000 Yuan per person;
- (e) Medical insurance;
- (f) Round-trip tickets provided by the Ministry of Commerce: students in two-year program can be also provided one round-trip ticket for family visit;
- (g) All degree students are required to take part in the annual evaluation. Those who satisfied the standard in the academic performance evaluation can continue to enjoy full scholarship in the next year;
- (h) Other expenses shall be administered and used by the Ministry of Commerce or the university, and shall not be distributed to the students. The Ministry of Commerce only provides students with financial support within the schooling year, which is stated in the admission notice, and students will not receive further funding for deferment.

2. Southern Medical University

(1) Brief Introduction

Southern Medical University (SMU) is the former First Military Medical University, was founded in October 1951 and notarized as one of the premier medical universities

in 1979. The university was handed over to the local government of Guangdong Province and meanwhile renamed as Southern Medical University, in line with the command by the State Department and the Central Military Committee of PLA in August 2004. SMU has become the only medical university among the high-level construction universities in Guangdong Province and one of the 8 prestigious universities authorized by the Ministry of Education to run the pilot 8-year medical education program. At present, SMU is the only medical university which ranks as one of the Ministry-Province Co-constructed Medical Universities in Guangdong Province. The university has been ranked top 500 in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings for three consecutive years and top 400 globally in 2023.

School Scale: SMU, located at the foot of the picturesque Baiyun Mountain in Guangzhou, has two campuses, the main campus and the Shunde campus, covering an area of nearly 1.68 million square meters, with a construction area of 0.845 million square meters. The university has 22 schools, 29 undergraduate majors, including 7 majors with national characteristics, 16 majors with Guangdong characteristics, 6 famous majors in Guangdong province and 23 national first-class undergraduate major construction sites with an enrollment of different degree candidates, including 14,129 undergraduates, 8,902 postgraduates and more than 1,000 international students.

Disciplines: SMU has 5 national key and cultivation disciplines, 6 National Administration of Traditional Chinese Medicine (NATCM) key disciplines, 10 Guangdong key disciplines. 13 disciplines were listed by ESI (Essential Science Indicators) as the world's top 1%, among which Clinical Medicine was listed as the world's top 0.5%, Pharmacology and Toxicology was listed as the world's top 1%. The overall ranking of ESI ranked 47th among national universities in China. At present, the university has 10 first-level disciplines for doctoral degree authorization and 15 first-level disciplines for master's degree authorization, 2 doctoral degree authorization points, 15 master's degree authorization points and 10 post-doctoral research mobile stations, forming a relatively complete degree authorization system with medicine as the main body and coordinated development of science, engineering, law, management, and education.

International Education: As an important part of the internationalization strategy of SMU, the university began international education as early as when it was known as the First Military Medical University. After three decades of development, the international education of the university has formed a good environment conducive enough to host the education of international students as well as China-aid training programs. At present, there are 1,066 international students (including 379 master and doctoral students) in SMU from 94 countries and regions around the world. As one of the Educational China Aid Bases designated by the Ministry of Education and a unit for organizing training programs sponsored by the Ministry of Commerce, up to present, the university has trained 3,640 foreign medical officials and professionals from 124 foreign countries and regions through 167 training programs. In 2015, the university organized the China-aid academic degree program "Master of Public

Health 2015-2017" (MPH) for the first time, which is a 2-academic-year program in English medium. Till now, it has enrolled 311 students from 52 countries.

(2) About the Schools

1) School of Public Health

The School of Public Health of Southern Medical University has the following 15 departments (centers and laboratories): Department of Epidemiology, Department of Bio-statistics, Department of Occupational health and medicine, Department of Environmental hygiene, Department of Nutrition and food hygiene, Department of Toxicology, Department of Radiation medicine, Department of Pathogenic biology, Department of Microbiology, Department of Psychology, P3 bio-safety laboratory, Department of Health inspection and quarantine (Health Inspection Center), Food Safety and Health Research Center, Mental Health Education and Consultation Center, and Preventive Medicine Experimental Teaching Center.

There are 131 faculty members, including 42 professors, 48 associate professors, 34 doctoral supervisors, and 68 master's supervisors. The School of Public Health has a group of excellent experts and scholars that include members of the subject review panel of the Degree Committee of the State Council, experts who enjoys special government allowances from the State Council, young and middle-aged experts with outstanding contributions from the Ministry of Health, national candidates for the "New Century National Hundred, Thousand and Ten Thousand Talents Project", winners of Wu Jieping-Paul Janssen Award in Medicine, winners of Guangdong Ding Ying Science and Technology Award, national excellent youth, leading talents of Guangdong Province, leading medical talents of Guangdong Province, distinguished professors of "Pearl River Scholars", provincial training objects of millions of talents of Guangzhou, winners of Outstanding Teacher Award of Guangdong Province, winners of Excellent Teacher of South Guangdong, winners of May 1st Labor Award, winners of FDA outstanding scientific achievement award and FDA outstanding analytical science award of America, and vice president of the Provincial and Ministerial Societies.

The school has established friendly and cooperative relations with 18 universities and education and research institutions in many countries and regions, and carried out various forms and channels of exchange and cooperation activities, including scientific research cooperation, Sino-foreign cooperation in running schools, overseas research and joint training of talents. It maintains good cooperation with international organizations such as the World Health Organization (WHO), the National Institutes of Health of American (NIH) and the Centers for Disease Control of American (CDC). It has established good communication and cooperation relations with Harvard University, Yale University, Johns Hopkins University, North Carolina University, British School of tropical diseases, Sydney University, La Trobe University, Griffith University, Auckland University, Seoul University, Tokyo University, Chinese

University of Hong Kong and other overseas universities. In recent years, the school has undertaken research projects such as NIH R01, projects from Nikolay Filipov of University of Georgia. In terms of teaching and training, the school has undertaken the Master of Public Health program, Doctor of Public Health and Preventive Medicine in "the Belt and Road" countries program, and seminars on infectious disease prevention and control in developing countries which all sponsored by the Chinese government. It has signed 6 inter school cooperation agreements, 2 exchange student agreements and more than 20 exchange and cooperation projects with foreign universities.

2) School of Health Management

The School of Health Management consists of three departments: Department of Health Management, Department of Law and Department of Economics. It has formed a complete education system and international education model for undergraduate, graduate and doctoral students.

The school has the National and Regional Research Center of the Ministry of Education - "WHO Research Center", Guangdong Provincial Humanities and Social Sciences Popularization Base - Public Health Emergency and Health Education Base, key laboratory of philosophy and social sciences in Guangdong Province - "Key Laboratory of Public Health Policy Research and Evaluation" and the key research base of humanities and social sciences in Guangzhou - "Research Base of Urban and Rural Public Health Service System Construction in Guangzhou". It has the national and regional research center of the Ministry of Education - "World Health Organization Research Center", the first International Research Institute of Health Law in China built with Association of Chinese Health Law.

It has been cooperating with ISCTE-Lisbon University Institute in Portugal in the doctoral degree program in Public Health Policy and Management for 14 years, and trained 350 foreign officials. It also cooperates with the University College of Lisbon in Portugal and the University of Birmingham in the United Kingdom to train masters in Medical and Health management, Health Economics and Health Policy. It has established friendly cooperative relations with many universities and educational and research institutions in many countries and regions, and carried out multi-form and multi-channel exchange and cooperation programs, including Sino-foreign cooperative education, overseas training, and joint training of talents.

(3) Introduction to Students' Living Environment and Conditions

The university is located in Guangzhou, a commercially developed city in south China, with a pleasant climate (the annual average temperature is about 20°C,

20-35°C in summer and 3-20°C in winter) and diverse culture. The campus is equipped with various public facilities, including the postal office, the cafeteria, the library and the stadium. Besides, the university offers single room with independent bathroom and balcony in the international student apartment building for this program. In each room, the furniture such as bed, wardrobe, bookshelf, TV cabinet, tables, chairs and sofa as well as electrical appliances such as air conditioner, washing machine, and TV set are prepared. Special classrooms are also established for teaching with brand-new decorations, and the equipment is in good condition.

1) Courses Introduction

♦ Master of Public Health (Science Division)

* Required Courses

Introduction to China A general course that systematically introduces the basic situation of China to international students. The main contents include China's natural and cultural conditions, Chinese politics, China's economy and Chinese society. It systematically and objectively shows international students China and Chinese culture by lectures, so that they can understand the basic situation of China in short time, and have a certain sensitivity and tolerance to cultural differences.

[Primary Chinese] This course mainly targets at students with zero basis of Chinese. It will teach the necessary phonetics, Chinese characters, vocabulary, sentences, etc. in daily conversation, so that students can master the most basic Chinese phonetics knowledge and pronunciation skills, the vocabulary of common words in the primary stage, and the basic Chinese sentence patterns; have good command of the basic strokes, stroke order and basic structure of Chinese characters, learn to write the Chinese characters; have the preliminary Chinese communication ability, can use Chinese to solve the most basic problems in daily life and study, and adapt to the study and life in China as soon as possible.

[Medical Statistics & Application of SPSS] In this course, the students are expected to comprehend the fundamentals of health statistics, master the application of common statistical methods and be familiar with various operations of SPSS. It

also aims to enable students to choose the correct statistical method according to different data type, and understand SPSS analysis results correctly, so as to lay a good foundation for independent scientific work and data processing.

[Acquisition and Management of Medical Information] This course focuses on cultivating students' information consciousness and literacy, and making them master the techniques on medical information retrieval and utilization. Through this course, students will know about the basic knowledge of information retrieval and management, and be familiar with the retrieval and utilization of commonly used online medical databases, search engines and other online medical information resources. Furthermore, the students are also expected to master the methods and skills in medical information integration and utilization and strengthen their abilities of self-study, research and innovation.

Toxicology Essentials Toxicology Essentials mainly studies the toxic effects and mechanism of exogenous chemicals on organisms, especially the human body. This course adheres to the principle of combining theories with practice. Through teaching, learning, discussing and various kinds of teaching activities, students will deeply understand the toxicity and rules of exogenous chemicals and become familiar with the basic theories and techniques of this subject, and also understand its developing tendency so as to lay a solid foundation for future work.

[Environmental Health] This course is to make students familiar with how the environment influences human health, master the law of natural development, so that they can put forward hygienic requirements and preventive countermeasures by making full use of the environmental beneficial factors and controlling harmful factors.

[Principles and Methods of Epidemiology] This course aims to help students to acquire the basic concept, theory and investigation method of epidemiology as well as the application of epidemiology in disease prevention and control. It introduces the distribution of diseases and health status in the population and its influencing factors, the strategies and measures for formulating and evaluating the prevention, control and elimination of diseases, so as to enable students to establish the thinking of epidemiological research, and have the ability to carry out disease investigation by using epidemiological research methods and techniques. The ultimate goal of this course is to help lay a foundation for applying the epidemiology theory and methods in the future practical work.

(Prevention and Control of Tropical Diseases) Tropical diseases are diseases that mainly occur in tropical and subtropical areas. All common tropical diseases in China and diseases unique to other tropical countries or areas are included in this course study. The primary task for students is to grasp the basic theory, knowledge and skills of tropical medicine through learning and practice, so as to lay the foundation for study on prevention and treatment of tropical diseases.

[Occupational Health and Safety] This course explores the harmful factors in working environment, and the prevention and treatment of discomfort or diseases caused by occupational hazards. The contents include the basic conception of

occupational disease and occupational safety, laws and regulations on occupational health and safety, occupational health, individual protection, etc. The course aims to lay the foundation for cultivating public heath talents in occupational safety and health service.

[Nutrition and Food Hygiene] This course refers to body nutrition and food safety which is closely related to the national health, including basic knowledge of nutriology, nutrition for special populations, public nutrition, food contamination and its prevention, and food safety management, etc. It aims to lay a solid theoretical basis for the related personnel who are engaged in public health.

Optional Courses

[Medical Thesis Writing] This course is a methodological course to cultivate and improve students' ability in research and scientific literacy. From the practical point of view, students will have a preliminary understanding of the basic scientific research procedures and rules of research topics and research deign, and master the principles of medical paper writing, contributing and revising so that to lay a good foundation for medical research.

Introduction to Global Health Global health is the area of study, research and practice that places a priority on improving health and achieving equity in health for all people worldwide. This course will introduce the basic research methods of global health. Health problems that transcend national borders or have a global political and economic impact are emphasized as well. The issues will be discussed include but not limit the following: global disease burden, climate change, air pollution, sustainable dietary pattern, food processing and food safety, neglected tropical diseases and emerging infectious disease (e.g. COVID-19), and other hot topics in this field.

[Women and Children's Health] Women and children are unique and vulnerable groups in global health. Global health interventions targeting women and children often have positive and lasting effects, such as large-scale malnutrition, improved prenatal care and increased immunization coverage, which are of great benefit to reducing incidence rate and mortality. This course will focus on assessing the growth patterns and methods of children's growth and development, risk factors and prevention strategies of common diseases in women and children, etc.

[Implementation Science] Implementation science, also known as the implementation research, is an emerging interdisciplinary field to solve the problem that evidence-based intervention methods are faced in the promotion of practice. It is also referred to the "Type II applied research", and it aims to promote evidence-based intervention method to be rapidly, conveniently and low costly mastered and applied by front-line practitioners, and to benefit the target population faster and more widely.

【 Designs and Methods of Health Services Research 】 Research design involves strategic planning and mapping out the overall approach to conducting a study, while research methods are the specific techniques used to carry out the design. The course will intuitively cover the principal research designs and methods used in health services research, the conditions under which these designs and methods are

applicable, the scientific principles underlying them, the strengths and weaknesses of different designs and methods, the tools associated with them, and the important considerations in implementing these designs and methods. Students will gain an understanding and initial ability to apply the fundamental designs and methods used in health services research and will be able to critically evaluate the scientific rigor of the research design and methods in scholarly articles they read.

[Introduction to Preclinical Medicine] This course targets at non-medical graduates. It is a brief overview of preclinical medicine and also a comprehensive course closely related to many disciplines in preclinical medicine.

[Medical Psychology] Medical Psychology is an interdisciplinary subject of psychology and medicine. It studies the laws and functions of the psychological problems in medical area. Through the study of this course, students will learn the psychosomatic dialectical viewpoint, master the basic theories and techniques application so as to achieve the model change of biological-psychological-social medicine, to further improve the prevention and treatment of diseases, enhance the quality of medical treatment and promote the physical and mental health of human beings.

[Global Health System] This course will review the basic concepts, history, and frameworks of health systems with a particular focus on the quality of care. It will also compare the different health systems across low and middle income countries. In particular, it will discuss China's health care system and the lessons learned in China's health reform that might be applied to other low and middle income countries. After learning this course, students will be able to appreciate the literature in health systems critically and to analyze the different components (such as governance, financing, payment, service delivery, medicines and etc.) of a given health system.

[Practice of Hospital Management] Based on the classical management theories and methods of hospital management practice both at home and abroad, this course interprets the commonly used theories and tools in hospital management from the aspects of hospital strategy, performance, service process, quality and safety, and information management, etc. with combination of the real situation of hospitals in our country. It is designed to help students better understand and master relevant theories and tools to improve the level of hospital management.

[Bio-safety] This course enables students to get basic knowledge for the work in laboratory, including the safe use of electricity, gas, chemical reagents, the management of Radioisotope laboratory, Microbiology Laboratory, Genetic engineering laboratory and preparation of regular experimental objects so as to lay a good theoretical and technical foundation for students who work in laboratory management or scientific research in the future.

[Modern Management] This course will systematically introduce the general rules, basic principles, management ideas, general methods and main functions of the management process, to cultivate the students' management abilities: planning and decision-making, organization and personnel management, leadership and communication, control and evaluation, and to train the comprehensive management

skills and quality of students.

[Management Research Method] This course introduces the foundations of social science research in general, especially the management and organizational research, including the basic concepts of management research methodology, management research ethics, scientific boundary and falsificationism, and positivism management research paradigms. It aims to help students develop critical and creative thinking, broaden their methodological perspectives and skills, and get well-prepared for independent research and publication in the public journal.

Hospital Management This course will enable students to understand the new progress of domestic and foreign hospital management, master the basic principles, tools and techniques of hospital management, and have good command of the common tools and methods of hospital management. It involves hospital strategic management, hospital organization management, medical quality management, doctor-patient relationship management, hospital culture construction, hospital infection management, hospital human resource management, hospital management communication, management ideas in traditional Chinese culture, etc.

[Health Care Management] This is a comprehensive course that introduces related management theory, health policy and management technology. With theories, methods and techniques of modern management science, it studies the basic law of health management, and learn how to reasonably collect, distribute and use limited health resources to increase social and economic benefits of health services and further to improve the public health.

[Health Promotion and Health Education] This is a course that introduces the prevention of diseases and the knowledge and skills of health promotion to the public. Students are required to grasp the way, method, and efficacy of health information dissemination so that to improve people's active prevention of disease and health management through the development of knowledge, beliefs and behaviors.

[Health Economics] As a course on the basic economic principles of health and health care, it focuses on economic evaluation, systems economics and health care economics knowledge in health care field.

[Overview of Clinical Medicine] This course targets at non-medical graduates, which is a brief overview of clinical medicine and a subject that studies the diagnostics basis and the common diseases of various clinical sections. It focuses on etiology, pathogenesis, clinical manifestations, diagnosis and treatment of common clinical emergencies, infectious diseases, internal medicine and surgical diseases, gynecological and pediatric diseases, as well as the important role of drugs in the prevention, treatment and diagnosis of diseases.

♦ Master of Public Health (Administration Division)

Required Courses

[Introduction to China] A general course that systematically introduces the basic

situation of China to international students. The main contents include China's natural and cultural conditions, Chinese politics, China's economy and Chinese society. It systematically and objectively shows international students China and Chinese culture by lectures, so that they can understand the basic situation of China in short time, and have a certain sensitivity and tolerance to cultural differences.

[Primary Chinese] This course mainly targets at students with zero basis of Chinese. It will teach the necessary phonetics, Chinese characters, vocabulary, sentences, etc. in daily conversation, so that students can master the most basic Chinese phonetics knowledge and pronunciation skills, the vocabulary of common words in the primary stage, and the basic Chinese sentence patterns; have good command of the basic strokes, stroke order and basic structure of Chinese characters, learn to write the Chinese characters; have the preliminary Chinese communication ability, can use Chinese to solve the most basic problems in daily life and study, and adapt to the study and life in China as soon as possible.

[Medical Statistics & Application of SPSS] In this course, the students are expected to comprehend the fundamentals of health statistics, master the application of common statistical methods and be familiar with various operations of SPSS. It also aims to enable students to choose the correct statistical method according to different data type, and understand SPSS analysis results correctly, so as to lay a good foundation for independent scientific work and data processing.

[Acquisition and Management of Medical Information] This course focuses on cultivating students' information consciousness and literacy, and making them master the techniques on medical information retrieval and utilization. Through this course, students will know about the basic knowledge of information retrieval and management, and be familiar with the retrieval and utilization of commonly used online medical databases, search engines and other online medical information resources. Furthermore, the students are also expected to master the methods and skills in medical information integration and utilization and strengthen their abilities of self-study, research and innovation.

[Modern Management] This course will systematically introduce the general rules, basic principles, management ideas, general methods and main functions of the management process, to cultivate the students' management abilities: planning and decision-making, organization and personnel management, leadership and communication, control and evaluation, and to train the comprehensive management skills and quality of students.

[Management Research Method] This course introduces the foundations of social science research in general, especially the management and organizational research, including the basic concepts of management research methodology, management research ethics, scientific boundary and falsificationism, and positivism management research paradigms. It aims to help students develop critical and creative thinking, broaden their methodological perspectives and skills, and get well-prepared for independent research and publication in the public journal.

[Hospital Management] This course will enable students to understand the new

progress of domestic and foreign hospital management, master the basic principles, tools and techniques of hospital management, and have good command of the common tools and methods of hospital management. It involves hospital strategic management, hospital organization management, medical quality management, doctor-patient relationship management, hospital culture construction, hospital infection management, hospital human resource management, hospital management communication, management ideas in traditional Chinese culture, etc.

[Health Care Management] This is a comprehensive course that introduces related management theory, health policy and management technology. With theories, methods and techniques of modern management science, it studies the basic law of health management, and learn how to reasonably collect, distribute and use limited health resources to increase social and economic benefits of health services and further to improve the public health.

[Health Promotion and Health Education] This is a course that introduces the prevention of diseases and the knowledge and skills of health promotion to the public. Students are required to grasp the way, method, and efficacy of health information dissemination so that to improve people's active prevention of disease and health management through the development of knowledge, beliefs and behaviors.

[Global Health System] This course will review the basic concepts, history, and frameworks of health systems with a particular focus on the quality of care. It will also compare the different health systems across low and middle income countries. In particular, it will discuss China's health care system and the lessons learned in China's health reform that might be applied to other low and middle income countries. After learning this course, students will be able to appreciate the literature in health systems critically and to analyze the different components (such as governance, financing, payment, service delivery, medicines and etc.) of a given health system.

[Designs and Methods of Health Services Research] Research design involves strategic planning and mapping out the overall approach to conducting a study, while research methods are the specific techniques used to carry out the design. The course will intuitively cover the principal research designs and methods used in health services research, the conditions under which these designs and methods are applicable, the scientific principles underlying them, the strengths and weaknesses of different designs and methods, the tools associated with them, and the important considerations in implementing these designs and methods. Students will gain an understanding and initial ability to apply the fundamental designs and methods used in health services research and will be able to critically evaluate the scientific rigor of the research design and methods in scholarly articles they read.

Optional Courses

[Implementation Science] Implementation science, also known as the implementation research, is an emerging interdisciplinary field to solve the problem that evidence-based intervention methods are faced in the promotion of practice. It is also referred to the "Type II applied research", and it aims to promote evidence-based

intervention method to be rapidly, conveniently and low costly mastered and applied by front-line practitioners, and to benefit the target population faster and more widely.

[Medical Psychology] Medical Psychology is an interdisciplinary subject of psychology and medicine. It studies the laws and functions of the psychological problems in medical area. Through the study of this course, students will learn the psychosomatic dialectical viewpoint, master the basic theories and techniques application so as to achieve the model change of biological-psychological-social medicine, to further improve the prevention and treatment of diseases, enhance the quality of medical treatment and promote the physical and mental health of human beings.

Toxicology Essentials Toxicology Essentials mainly studies the toxic effects and mechanism of exogenous chemicals on organisms, especially the human body. This course adheres to the principle of combining theories with practice. Through teaching, learning, discussing and various kinds of teaching activities, students will deeply understand the toxicity and rules of exogenous chemicals and become familiar with the basic theories and techniques of this subject, and also understand its developing tendency so as to lay a solid foundation for future work.

[Environmental Health] This course is to make students familiar with how the environment influences human health, master the law of natural development, so that they can put forward hygienic requirements and preventive countermeasures by making full use of the environmental beneficial factors and controlling harmful factors.

Introduction to Global Health Global health is the area of study, research and practice that places a priority on improving health and achieving equity in health for all people worldwide. This course will introduce the basic research methods of global health. Health problems that transcend national borders or have a global political and economic impact are emphasized in this course. The issues will be discussed include but not limit the following: global disease burden, climate change, air pollution, sustainable dietary pattern, food processing and food safety, neglected tropical diseases and emerging infectious disease (e.g. COVID-19), and other hot topics in this field.

[Women and Children's Health] Women and children are unique and vulnerable groups in global health. Global health interventions targeting women and children often have positive and lasting effects, such as large-scale malnutrition, improved prenatal care and increased immunization coverage, which are of great benefit to reducing incidence rate and mortality. This course will focus on assessing the growth patterns and methods of children's growth and development, risk factors and prevention strategies of common diseases in women and children, etc.

[Introduction to Preclinical Medicine] This course targets at non-medical graduates. It is a brief overview of preclinical medicine and also a comprehensive course closely related to many disciplines in preclinical medicine.

[Medical Thesis Writing] This course is a methodological course to cultivate and

improve students' ability in research and scientific literacy. From the practical point of view, students will have a preliminary understanding of the basic scientific research procedures and rules of research topics and research deign, and master the principles of medical paper writing, contributing and revising so that to lay a good foundation for medical research.

[Health Economics] As a course on the basic economic principles of health and health care, it focuses on economic evaluation, systems economics and health care economics knowledge in health care field.

[Practice of Hospital Management] Based on the classical management theories and methods of hospital management practice both at home and abroad, this course interprets the commonly used theories and tools in hospital management from the aspects of hospital strategy, performance, service process, quality and safety, and information management, etc. with combination of the real situation of hospitals in our country. It is designed to help students better understand and master relevant theories and tools to improve the level of hospital management.

[Bio-safety] This course enables students to get basic knowledge for the work in laboratory, including the safe use of electricity, gas, chemical reagents, the management of Radioisotope laboratory, Microbiology Laboratory, Genetic engineering laboratory and preparation of regular experimental objects so as to lay a good theoretical and technical foundation for students who work in laboratory management or scientific research in the future.

[Principles and Methods of Epidemiology] This course aims to help students to acquire the basic concept, theory and investigation method of epidemiology as well as the application of epidemiology in disease prevention and control. It introduces the distribution of diseases and health status in the population and its influencing factors, the strategies and measures for formulating and evaluating the prevention, control and elimination of diseases, so as to enable students to establish the thinking of epidemiological research, and have the ability to carry out disease investigation by using epidemiological research methods and techniques. The ultimate goal of this course is to help lay a foundation for applying the epidemiology theory and methods in the future practical work.

(Prevention and Control of Tropical Diseases) Tropical diseases are diseases that mainly occur in tropical and subtropical areas. All common tropical diseases in China and diseases unique to other tropical countries or areas are included in this course study. The primary task for students is to grasp the basic theory, knowledge and skills of tropical medicine through learning and practice, so as to lay the foundation for study on prevention and treatment of tropical diseases.

[Occupational Health and Safety] This course explores the harmful factors in working environment, and the prevention and treatment of discomfort or diseases caused by occupational hazards. The contents include the basic conception of occupational disease and occupational safety, laws and regulations on occupational health and safety, occupational health, individual protection, etc. The course aims to lay the foundation for cultivating public heath talents in occupational safety and

health service.

(Nutrition and Food Hygiene) This course refers to body nutrition and food safety which is closely related to the national health, including basic knowledge of nutriology, nutrition for special populations, public nutrition, food contamination and its prevention, and food safety management, etc. It aims to lay a solid theoretical basis for the related personnel who are engaged in public health.

(Overview of Clinical Medicine) This course targets at non-medical graduates, which is a brief overview of clinical medicine and a subject that studies the diagnostics basis and the common diseases of various clinical sections. It focuses on etiology, pathogenesis, clinical manifestations, diagnosis and treatment of common clinical emergencies, infectious diseases, internal medicine and surgical diseases, gynecological and pediatric diseases, as well as the important role of drugs in the prevention, treatment and diagnosis of diseases.

2) Curriculum Provision

The MPH program consists of four semesters of full-time academic work, with a minimum course requirement of 43 credits to complete the degree, including course study, social practice and scientific research activities. Among them, there are no less than 36 credits for course study, no less than 4 credits for social practice and no less than 3 credits for scientific research activities.

(2) Teaching Methods

Course teaching, practice and field study.

(3) Semesters Arrangement

Southern Medical University adopts two semesters in one academic year, and this program has four semesters. Course teaching will be arranged in the first and second semester, and by the end of the second semester, students will be required to select a research topic under the guidance of the supervisor and finish a thesis proposal. In the third semester, research is combined with practical investigation. Students are expected to complete their thesis and pass thesis defense in the fourth semester.

(4) Thesis

1) Thesis Requirements

Students need to make a thesis work plan under the guidance of their supervisor, in which detailed arrangements should be made for research methods, experimental scheme and methods, thesis writing, deadlines and expected results. Normally they need to complete thesis proposal in the second semester, submit formal thesis and participate in thesis defense at the beginning of the fourth semester.

2) Defense Requirements

Students must complete all the required courses and practice, get through course

assessments, complete the required credits and submit the practice research report before the thesis defense application. The preliminary thesis is required to be reviewed by the supervisor before submission to the reviewers. The formal defense is only for the eligible applicants. Specific arrangement will be implemented by the School of Public Health and School of Health Service Management of Southern Medical University. Please refer to the Master's degree defense requirements of Southern Medical University for uncovered matters.

(5) Degrees

The master degree of Public Health will be conferred on students who had successfully completed the required credit courses and the master thesis, passed the thesis defense within the required time period and got approval from University Degree Committee.

II Application

1. Requirement

All applicants must meet the following admission requirements:

- (1) Applicants must be non-Chinese citizens from developing countries and aged below 45 (born after September 1st, 1979);
- (2) Applicants must be physically and mentally healthy, can provide health certificate or physical examination form issued by the local public hospitals upon request and have no diseases prohibited by Chinese laws and regulations to enter or stay in China for a long time. Applicants with severe chronic diseases such as serious high blood pressure, cardiovascular/cerebrovascular diseases, diabetes and cancer, etc., or with mental diseases or epidemic diseases that are likely to cause serious threat to public health, or in the process of recovering after a major operation or in the process of acute diseases, or seriously disabled, will be declined to attend this program. Pregnant women are not allowed to attend this program in China. If they become pregnant while studying in China, they will be expelled from the school;
- (3) Applicants should have a bachelor degree recognized by Chinese Ministry of Education, and at least three years of working experience;
- (4) Applicants should have a medical related education or working background. Administrative personnel and professional public health talents from public health departments of developing countries, including health administrative departments, hospitals, disease control centers, community health organizations and inspection & quarantine organizations are preferred;

- (5) Applicants should serve as the senior administrators (charge a department or above), senior managers, academic backbones of the government departments, various institutions and enterprises, universities and scientific research institutions of their own countries;
- (6) Applicants should be proficient in English (Applicants from non-English-speaking countries must reach a score above 6.5 in IELTS (6.0 or above for each item) or 90 in TOEFL (20 or above for each item); or provide other comparable certificates proving English proficiency. Applicants from English-speaking countries or receiving the last degree with the instruction in English are exempt from submitting the English proficiency certificates, but the certificate of English medium issued by the school graduated from shall be provided);
- (7) Applicants should have the potential for career development, intend to promote friendly exchanges and cooperation between their own countries and China;
- (8) Students who have studied in China or have been admitted to other Chinese government scholarship programs are not allowed to apply.

2. Procedure

(1) Application for Admission

Applicants' current organization should send a recommendation to the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Office, Embassy of the People's Republic of China.

Upon approval, visit Southern Medical University International Student Service System at https://fimmu.at0086.cn/Student, upload the required materials, and complete the online application ("Financial Support" type please select "scholarship of Chinese Ministry of Commerce"). Failure to provide accurate materials as required shall be regarded as an invalid application. Please provide all paper application materials when registration.

Wuxi Fisheries College of Nanjing Agricultural University

Nanjing Agricultural University (NAU), founded in 1902, is a state key university and on the list of "Double First-Class" university project under the Ministry of Education of China. With agriculture and life sciences as its orientations, NAU has a harmonious development of diverse branches of learning including agriculture, science, economy, management, engineering, art, law, etc. During it's over 120 years of education, NAU has graduated more than 300, 000 talents including 62 academicians.

Wuxi Fisheries College of Nanjing Agricultural University (WFC), located in Wuxi City of Jiangsu Province, was jointly established by Freshwater Fisheries Research Center of Chinese Academy of Fishery Sciences (FFRC) with NAU in 1993, and started MSc education in 1996. Currently, it provides 2 PhD programs respectively in Aquaculture (first-class discipline) and Hydrobiology, and 3 MSc programs in Aquaculture, Hydrobiology and Fishery Development; besides, it has 1 postdoctoral station for Aquaculture. Meanwhile, WFC is among the first institutes that set up Professional Master's Program (PMP) in Fishery development. So far, it has granted 2,300 students with bachelor degree, more than 130 PhD degrees and more than 980 master degrees, among which 123 are international students have graduated since the international education program launched in 2015.

In 2011, WFC obtained the ISO9001 quality management system recognition. Right now, there are 40 professors, 56 associate professors, 14 doctoral supervisors, 54 master supervisors. Since its establishment, it has undertaken over 2300 national-level, provincial and ministerial-level projects, and it has won 11 nationals, 87 provincial and ministerial level awards for S&T progress, and 568 patents for invention. Since 1981, FFRC began to organize international training programs, so far, nearly 7780 fishery technicians and officials from 134 countries and regions have been trained here. The trainees spread across 5 continents, and most of them have become technical backbones or industry leaders in their own countries. Among them, there are more than 120 officials at the DG level and nearly 20 officials at the ministerial level. They play an important role in the fishery field of their respective countries. Meanwhile, WFC/FFRC has dispatched over 130 fishery experts to more than 30 developing countries such as South Africa, Egypt, North Korea, Laos, Bangladesh, Iran, Myanmar, Tajikistan, Namibia, Mozambique, to provide technical consultation and trainings. In 2014, WFC/FFRC was designated as the FAO Reference Centre for Aquaculture and Inland Fishery Research and Training, and established two international joint laboratories. In 2021, FFRC was approved as the first batch of "China-Africa Joint Center for Modern Agrotechnology Exchange, Demonstration and Training".

A team of high-level, reliable English proficiency and rich management experiences has been forged during the long period of international training and education. The postgraduate education programs of WFC are based on supervisor-responsible system and allocated with

professional management team to make full advantage of team-leadership. WFC also strictly adhere to the quality management standard of ISO9001 system for its course arrangement to teaching evaluation; it demonstrates the Chinese characteristics while absorbing the merits of world-famous universities, and strives for high quality and utmost effect.

Being jointly established by NAU and FFRC, the college has a very strong scientific research strength with both advanced experiment equipment and other perfect facilities for teaching, research, practice and living. It has two campuses with an area of 26 ha in total, a library with over 30,000 books and periodicals, as well as its own periodical publication, the "Scientific Fish Farming". In addition, the college has 15 multimedia classrooms, 2 multi-function halls, 5 meeting rooms, 2 dormitory building, and a hotel with 72 standard rooms, a Chinese restaurant, a western restaurant and a Halal restaurant. The outdoor football ground, basketball court, tennis court, and the indoor gym, badminton court, table tennis rooms, billiards room, etc. are open to all participants. Moreover, the college owns one shuttle bus, one minibus, and several cars for daily and urgent use.

The duration of this program is 2 years. Those who successfully complete their studies will receive a diploma from Nanjing Agricultural University and a Master's degree in Agriculture (Title: Fishery development).

I Program Description

Prospective Students:

Our prospective students are officials or technicians with a bachelor's degree in Fishery and Aquaculture, and those with relevant working experience in Fishery and Aquaculture will be preferred.

Program Objective:

To cultivate senior inter-disciplinary and practical fishery talents and practitioners for the developing countries with the following capabilities:

• A profound knowledge of basic theories and professional knowledge of fishery science, familiar with the world fishery S&T development and equipped with a comprehensive knowledge structure;

- A spirit of innovation and practices, capable of independently engaging in aquaculture technology research, application, development, dissemination and extension, professional education of the fishery field and rural developing tasks;

- A rigorous style of study, good morality, committed to promoting the development of fisheries and agricultural industries through strengthening S&T cooperation between his/her country and China.

Enrollment Plan:

In 2024, we plan to enroll **20** overseas students in this master program, majoring in **Fishery Development**. The duration of this program is **2 years**.

II Education Plan

Our master degree program is a two-year full-time program. Students enrolled in this program are expected to complete the coursework, conduct research based on lab work or investigation, and write a thesis within 2 years.

Language of instruction: While all non-Chinese speaking students are required to take one course on the Chinese language learning, the language of instruction of the program is English.

1) Orientation

Before formal coursework starts, admitted students are required to take a one-week orientation session in China. The orientation session, led by prominent scholars and managerial staff, serves as a general introduction to China, the program and the college.

2) Formal Coursework

Our formal coursework covers the contents of general situation of agriculture and fishery, basic theories of fishery science, practical technologies, etc. A more schematic layout of the coursework is listed as follows:

The total credits shall not be less than 29 credits, including 7 credits for compulsory session and no less than 22 credits for courses.

Classes will incorporate a mix of lectures, seminars, lab work, case discussions, tutorials, study tours and presentations.

3) Field Study

Field trips will be arranged for students to visit China's fishery management agencies, fishery institutions for research, education or technical extension, fish farms, hatcheries, and processing plants in some of the major fishery and aquaculture areas such as Jiangsu Province, Zhejiang province, Shanghai city and Beijing city, to gain first-hand knowledge on fishery and aquaculture practices under various changing conditions in the reform and opening-up process of China.

4) Independent Research

Students are required to come to WFC with practical problems to be addressed which have to do with the fishery and aquaculture development of the student's own country. With the guidance of a supervisor, a student is expected to carry out independent research on a prudently selected research topic related to fishery, including the design of necessary experiment or practices, lab work, result analysis, etc., based on which the final thesis would be written.

5) Thesis

Master thesis: By the end of the first semester, a student shall choose or be allocated with a professor as his/her supervisor, and determine the subject matter on the basis of a real problem to be solved in his/her own countries. In the second semester, students are expected to draft the research plan and initiate the research, and at the end of the semester, students need to pass an oral defense for their research proposal. In the beginning of the third semester, students will further carry out their research and thesis writing. In the fourth semester, students should finish their thesis writing and pass the final defense.

Thesis shall be written in English with a Chinese abstract.

6) Degrees

A professional master degree of fishery development will be conferred upon a candidate in this master program after his/her successful completion of required credits and thesis.

IV Financial Aid

The Chinese Ministry of Commerce will provide "Chinese Government Scholarships" to admitted students from the developing countries. These scholarships cover both tuition and living expenses. They also include a round-trip international airfare for all the students for coming and returning, and another round-trip international airfare for home visit (one time, between the academic years). In terms of living stipend, it is 3000 RMB/month for the master program. There is also a one-time settlement allowance of 3000RMB/person for coming to China.

If a student expects to have his/her spouse, children, relatives or friends to visit him/her during the stay in Wuxi, the visitor will have to bear all the expenses by himself/herself.

V Application

1. Requirement

All applicants must meet the following admission requirements:

- 1) Applicants must be non-Chinese citizens from developing countries, not older than 45 years old (born after September 1, 1979), with a valid passport, or any other identification certificate sufficient to verify his/her nationality;
- 2) Applicants must have attained a Junior College degree or above;
- 3) Applicants must be proficient in English. Non-native English speakers or candidates whose undergraduate education was not conducted in English are required to submit a test score of TOEFL or IELTS as proof of English proficiency. Applicants with the following scores would be considered competitive:
- TOEFL 80 or above in overall band score;
- IELTS 6.0 or above in overall band score.
- 4) All applicants shall be in good physical conditions and carry no infectious diseases which may have a serious impact on public health or fall into any of the health situations prohibited by China's Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Laws and Regulations. No severe hypertension, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, cancer or other serious chronic diseases, mental illness or infectious diseases that may pose a significant public health risk, recovery from major surgery or

acute illness, or severe physical disability.

Pregnant women are not allowed to participate and will be withdrawn from the program if they become pregnant while studying in China.

5) Only applicants recommended by the Economic and Commercial Counsellor's Office of Chinese Embassy in the country that accords with the candidate's nationality will be considered.

About the Program

i. General Information

◆ Brief Introduction

The Diploma & Degree Education Program for Developing Countries was initiated in 2008 by the Ministry of Commerce (MOFCOM) of the People's Republic of China with the support of China's Foreign Aid Fund. It aims to cultivate high-end financial and commercial officials as well as administrative talents in the aided countries. This Program is devoted to cultivating high-level, inter-disciplinary and application-oriented talents in the fields of politics, commercial trade, diplomacy, agriculture, science, education, literature, health, energy, transportation and public administration and providing intellectual support for the economic and social development in the aided countries.

The program mainly supports in-service government officials, academic researchers, and senior management personnel in related fields from the aided countries to pursue master's and doctoral degrees in English in China. Due to the short duration of the education system, students are required to obtain a



bachelor's degree in advance and have some work experience in the corresponding field, in order to timely and fully understand the teaching and learning content. Students are required to have a good health condition to adapt to high-intensity learning and ultimately obtain a degree. The program is playing an increasingly important role in the economic and trade cooperation and development between China and the aided countries, and is highly valued by the governments of the aided countries.

2024 Master of Audit Program is one of the programs under the Diploma & Degree Education Program for Developing Countries. Nanjing Audit University has undertaken the training work of the program since 2017, and has accumulated rich experience, good resources and conditions for running the program.

♦ About the Applicants

This Program mainly funds the auditors or auditing-related working staff from SAIs of developing countries, who already have bachelor's degrees before application and a certain amount of work experience in auditing.

♦ Cultivation Objectives

The Program aims to cultivate high-level, interdisciplinary and application-oriented audit professionals: who possess a certain level of communication skills in Chinese language that enable them to strengthen communication and mutual learning with their Chinese counterparts; who possess good professionalism and a strong sense of work ethics that enable them to understand the socialist auditing system with Chinese characteristics, and understand China through the auditing platform; who actively contribute to promoting international exchange and deepening the friendship and cooperation between countries through the platform of auditing; and who



possess a systematic command of knowledge and techniques in modern national audit and relevant fields, and the ability to solve practical audit problems and sound audit competency.

♦ Admission Quota

The 2024 China Ministry of Commerce Scholarship Master of Audit Program is undertaken by Nanjing Audit University. The 2-year program plans to enroll 40 full-time candidates in the major of government audit and all the courses will be taught in English.

♦ Financial Aid

- 1. After admission, the students do not have to pay for the tuition fee, textbooks and learning materials, the research and field trips, the subsidies for developing the English-taught program, the graduation thesis guidance fee.
 - 2. A room on campus will be provided to the students for free.
- 3. The standard for living allowance is RMB 3,000 yuan per person per month from the registered month till leaving the university at graduation in 2026, which will be paid to the students on a monthly basis by Nanjing Audit University.
- 4. RMB 3,000 yuan will be paid to the students as one-time settlement fee.
- 5. The students will be provided with comprehensive medical insurance in China.
- 6. The scholarship also covers a flight ticket for a student to come to China at enrollment and a flight ticket for a student to go back to their home country at graduation. In addition, within the two-year program, MOFCOM will provide one round-trip flight tickets for home visits.



- 7. An annual review will be conducted for each student, and those who pass the annual review can continue their studies with the support of the scholarship.
- 8. The remaining part of the scholarship will be utilized by MOFCOM or Nanjing Audit University according to an overall plan and will not be distributed to students. MOFCOM only sponsors the students who graduate within the program duration. The students who have to postpone their studies due to various reasons will not be further funded.

ii. About Nanjing Audit University

♦ Overall Introduction

Nanjing Audit University (NAU) is the only full-time undergraduate institute at home and abroad that carries "Audit" in its name, and is one of the birthplaces of audit higher education in China. It has been established, developed, flourished and elevated for audit. NAU was initially founded in 1983, and became a university jointly built by the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Finance, the National Audit Office and the People's Government of Jiangsu Province in 2011, and became a master's degree granting unit in 2013, and was approved by the Ministry of Education to change its name to the current name in 2015, and in 2022, the university became a doctoralgranting unit officially and was selected as a B-class university under the Jiangsu High Level University Construction Summit Plan. On July 4, 2023, President Xi Jinping replied to the international students of the Master of Audit Program, encouraging them to strengthen communication and mutual learning with their Chinese counterparts, to learn more about and understand China through the platform of auditing, and to actively contribute to deepening friendship and cooperation between countries.



NAU's current full-time undergraduates, postgraduates and international students total more than 18,000. It has a full-time teaching faculty of more than 1,200, amongst whom more than 200 with senior professional titles, 760 more with doctoral degrees. Today's NAU consists of two campuses in Pukou and Mochou respectively, covering a total area of 1.2 million square meters. The CPC School of National Audit Office of China and its Audit Academy are both located on NAU Pukou Campus.

NAU has built a system of disciplines and specialties with auditing as the brand and the disciplines of economics, management, law, engineering, literature and science supporting each other and developing in a synergistic way. The university has 1 post-doctorate station, 1 first-level doctoral degree program, 8 first-level master's degree programs, and 13 master's degree programs. There are 3 advantageous disciplines in Jiangsu universities and 6 key disciplines in Jiangsu Province. The university received an A grade in the comprehensive evaluation of graduate student education of the provincial level for three consecutive years.

NAU has 20 colleges, and 5 special research institutes; it has implemented the "dual system" education model of academies and colleges. NAU has 38 undergraduate majors, including 18 national first-class undergraduate majors, 11 provincial first-class majors, 3 special majors of the Ministry of Education, 2 "Comprehensive Reform Pilot Projects" of the Ministry of Education, 5 "Twelfth Five-Year Plan" key majors of Jiangsu Province, 3 brand majors and 5 special majors of Jiangsu Province. There are 14 national first-class undergraduate courses, 1 national level ideological and political demonstration course, and 1 national level virtual teaching and research team. The university has 1 national teaching team, 8 national teaching teachers of curriculum thinking and politics, 1 national ideological and political education teaching team, 5 excellent teaching teams of "Youth and Blue Project" in Jiangsu Province.



NAU is the organizer of the CGSAMP program which were coestablished by the National Audit Office of China and the Ministry of Education, and the organizer of Master of Auditing Program which was established by the Ministry of Commerce. It enrolls and cultivates student of master's degree in auditing from countries along the "the Belt and Road", and has passed the accreditation of overseas student education by the Ministry of Education. It has been certified by IIA as the only IAEP partner-level university in China, and has been engaged in student exchange, faculty recruitment, mutual recognition of credits, and scientific research cooperation with global partner universities. It has been accredited by ACCA as the "University that Has Trained Most ACCA Talents" and "Platinum Level Training Institution"; it has also cooperated with many world-renowned institutions in the UK, the USA, Russia, France, Australia, Korea, Italy, South Africa, Kazakhstan and so on; it has cooperated with SKEMA Business School in France to establish an international joint audit school and established a cooperative education program in accounting with Curtin University in Australia. The university has been approved as a base construction unit for the Ministry of Education's "High-level International Talent Training Innovative Practice Project". The university has collaborated with the Center for Cultural Exchange between China and Foreign Countries of the Ministry of Education to establish the "Institute for Audit Cultural Exchange between China and Foreign Countries". It is selected for the "Jiangsu UK High Level University Alliance", "Jiangsu Canada University Cooperation Alliance", and "Jiangsu Korea University Cooperation Alliance". A total of 71 person-times were selected to perform 101 UN audit assignments, and 15 faculty members were selected for the UN audit talent pool; We have established extensive cooperation with international organizations such as INTOSAI, ASOSAI, United Nations Board of Auditors,



United Nations Office of Internal Oversight Services, World Bank, The Institute of Internal Auditors, Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, International Federation of Accountants, etc. Richard F. Chambers, the former President and CEO of IIA, was appointed as the overseas dean. Auditor-Generals from nearly 30 countries and regions such as the United States, France, Brazil, India, South Africa and others, have been appointed as honorary professors of NAU. NAU has organized more than 30 important international conferences, seminars, forums, etc.

The university has been ranked among the first-class universities in the comprehensive assessment in Jiangsu Province for three consecutive years. At present, NAUers are being led by the Party Committee of the university, guided by President Xi Jinping's thought of socialism with Chinese characteristics in the new era, anchored on the goals established by the fifth Party Congress of the university, and striving to build a world-class university with distinctive auditing characteristics.

♦ About the Program Implementing Units

1. School of International Students (SIS)

The School of International Students of Nanjing Audit University caters to international students and aims to promote cross-cultural exchange among Chinese and foreign students, cultivating international talents who are familiar with Chinese culture and committed to the common development of countries around the world. Up to now, a total of 304 international students from 73 "Belt and Road" countries have come the university to further their studies in auditing, and 219 of them have successfully completed their master program and become the backbone in the auditing area and the friendly ambassadors for auditing exchanges between China and their home countries.



SIS shoulders responsibilities of recruiting all-leveled qualified candidates for China Government Scholarship, specialized scholarships sponsored by different Chinese ministries, Jiangsu Provincial Scholarship, Nanjing Municipal Scholarship, and Nanjing Audit University International Students Scholarship. With the focus on the brand-major of auditing, the scholarships are available for both undergraduates and postgraduates in 15 different majors, such as auditing, accounting, economics, international trade, etc. SIS is in charge of the strategic planning of international students' affairs of NAU, the students' enrollment issues and daily administration. It has 2 offices, namely the Office of General Affairs (OGA) and the Management Office of International Students (MOIS), and has 5 international student education practice bases.

2. School of Government Audit (SGA)

The School of Government Auditing (SGA) is positioned to cultivate multi-level high-quality auditing professionals, build an auditing theory research base, and create a senior think tank to serve national governance and regional economic development. SGA innovatively selects and hires outstanding teachers as master's supervisors of auditing majors throughout the university, there are 5 doctoral supervisors, 90 master's supervisors, 5 second-level professors, 2 "Excellent Talents of the New Century" from the Ministry of Education, 3 "High-end Accounting Academic Talents" from the Ministry of Finance, 8 "333 High-level Talents Training Project" from Jiangsu Province, 6 academic leaders from the "Youth and Blue Project" of Jiangsu Province, 7 excellent young backbone teachers of "Youth and Blue Project" in colleges and universities in Jiangsu Province, 1 excellent teaching team of "Youth and Blue Project", 1 special professor in Jiangsu Province, 4 high-level talents of "Six Talent Summits" in Jiangsu Province, 11 scholars are among the top 100 most influential scholars in auditing disciplines in



China, and the "Auditing Postgraduate Tutor Team" was nominated the "Top 10 Tutor Team" in Jiangsu Province.

♦ About the Living Environment and Accommodation Conditions

Nanjing, known as Jinling in ancient times, is the capital of Jiangsu Province. It is a sub-provincial city, a mega-city, the core city of Nanjing metropolitan area. It is also an important central city in the eastern region of China, an important national scientific research and education base and a comprehensive transportation hub as determined by the State Council. Nanjing is located in the eastern part of China, downstream of the Yangtze River, near the river and the sea, and is an important gateway city of the Yangtze River Delta radiating and driving the development of the central and western regions, as well as an important node city of the strategic intersection of the eastern coastal economic belt and the Yangtze River economic belt, as planned by the State Council.

Nanjing is a hilly area, dominated by low hills and gentle hills, with a humid north subtropical climate and a water area of more than 11%. It is one of the first national historical and cultural cities, an important birthplace of Chinese civilization, and has long been the political, economic and cultural center of southern China. Nanjing has a humid climate with four distinct seasons and a moderate price level, the annual average temperature is 15.4 °C. It is a suitable place to live in.

Nanjing Audit University provides single rooms on Pukou Campus for Master of Audit Program students. Each room is equipped with an airconditioner, a refrigerator, a washing machine, a washroom, shower facilities, wireless network access, etc. A shared kitchenette is available on each floor of the building. Apart from dormitories and canteens, there are sports playgrounds, clinic, post office, convenience stores, hair salon, laundry shop,



printing shops, etc. There are public buses and taxis available right outside of the school gate, and it takes less than 10 minutes' bus ride to the center of the local downtown. There are banks, supermarkets, restaurants, hospitals and city metros available in the district community.

iii. About the Teaching Arrangements

◆Course Settings

The Master of Audit Program students are required to attain 48 credits to fulfill the requirements of degree application. The course system is composed of seven modules, namely, compulsory basic courses, specialty core courses (for degree), general knowledge courses, selective courses, master course, international conferences and academic lectures, practice and internship, and degree thesis.

- Basic course: 14 credits, compulsory.
- Specialty core courses (for degree): 21 credits, compulsory.
- Selective courses: 6 credits at least.
- Master Course: 1 credit, compulsory. Students are required to attend lectures given by current or former senior officials from the highest audit institutions of China or other countries around the world or various international audit organizations for at least 17 class hours. A report based on these lectures is required to be submitted.
- International conference and academic lectures: 1 credit, compulsory. Students are required to attend at least international conferences or academic lectures 6 times. Relevant academic reports are required to be submitted to tutors and the administrative body.
- Practice and internship: 2 credits, compulsory. The students are required to attend the on-site study tours co-organized by China National Audit Office and Nanjing Audit University for the Master of Audit Program



Students, including attending topic-related lectures held before the trips, accumulating related materials for study, taking part in the study tours, and writing a report based on each study trips.

♦ Degree Thesis

Degree thesis should be closely linked with national auditing practice and reflect students' competency in applying audit and related discipline theory, knowledge and methodology to analyze and solve practical problem. It can be written in the form of an academic research report, a policy research report, a monographic study, or a case analysis. Whatever the form of the thesis, it should reflect the students' capability in applying basic theories and professional knowledge to solve practical issues.

Both Chinese and English languages are all accepted in writing the thesis, while the abstract is required to be written in Chinese.

International students without special cases are required to stay in China in the 4th semester to complete their thesis writing as well as the internship. In case of materials and data needed from home countries for the thesis writing, this should be done during the summer or winter vacation.

The Thesis defense must be taken in Nanjing Audit University upon gaining all the required credits. The form of thesis defense is to be decided by the related cultivating departments. The Thesis Defense Committee would include some experts with professional posts in the audit practice field. Three credits will be granted to a successful defense.

♦ Degree Conferring



According to Nanjing Audit University Master of Audit Program Education Plan, the students are required to: finish all the required courses and gain the required credits, write a degree thesis in topics related to audit and pass the thesis defense, and pass the International Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK Level 3).

Having attained all the credits, passed the thesis defense, and met the requirements listed in the Regulations on Academic Degrees of the People's Republic of China, candidates need to file an application for the degree. Candidates are to be conferred the Master of Auditing at the approval of the University's Academic Degree Evaluation Committee.







Application Methods

i. Criteria for Application

2024 China Ministry of Commerce Scholarship Master of Audit Program is intended for auditors or auditing-related working staff from respective SAIs of developing countries in Asia, Africa, Latin America and South Pacific Region. Applicants should meet up with the following requirements:

- 1. Applicants should be non-Chinese citizens from developing countries who are below 45 years old (born after September 1st, 1979).
- 2. Applicants should be in good physical and mental health. The health certificate or the physical examination form issued by local public hospital is required. They should not carry any entry-forbidden diseases in accordance with the Chinese laws and regulations. No serious hypertension, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, cancer and other severe chronic diseases, mental illness or other diseases that might cause massive infection and severe harm to public health; not in a major surgery recovery phase or acute disease



ictal phases, no serious physical disability. In accordance with relevant regulations, females that are pregnant shall not be admitted, and the scholarship will be discontinued when the females get pregnant in the process of study.

- 3. Applicants are supposed to have bachelor's degree or degrees above bachelor's degree and the work experience of at least 3 years.
- 4. Priorities will be given to applicants who are involved in the work or study related to audit.
- 5. Priorities will be given to applicants who are government officials ranked as or above section chiefs in their home countries, who are senior managers of various institutions or enterprises, who are academic backbones of higher educational and research institutions.
- 6. Applicants should have a good command of English which enables them to learn the courses taught in English (Reference: IELTS 6.0 or above, TOFEL 80 or above or other English test certificates with similar level).
- 7. Applicants should have career development potential in the relevant field and be willing to promote the friendly exchange and cooperation between their home countries and China.
- 8. Those who are currently studying in China or admitted by other Chinese Government Scholarship programs are not allowed to apply for this program.

ii. Application Procedures

♦ Application Documents

Please get the following documents ready before you start your application:

1. Recommendation Letter from Institutions: The recommendation letter issued by the institution with which the applicant works should include



introducing the applicant and expressing the willingness to recommend the applicant to study in China. Applicants recommended by SAIs should present the recommendation letter from Head of SAIs. Priorities will be given to those applicants with recommendation letters written by Head of SAIs.

- 2. Recommendation Letter from Professionals. The letter should be written by professionals with the title of associate professor or higher. The letter should focus on academic qualification, major field of study, achievement and research ability.
- 3. Photocopies of Diploma or Certificate: "Graduation Certificate" and "Certificate of Degree" of your most advanced studies.
 - 4. Photocopy of Academic Transcript of your most advanced studies.
- 5. Resume: Please specify your personal experience, academic experience after high school, and work experience.
- 6. Statement of purpose: Please specify your personal plan and purpose of studying the related major in China.
- 7. Study or research plan: Please specify the goals of study and research to be accomplished during the study in China.
- 8. Photocopy of the private passport: the photocopy of the information page of the passport, which clearly shows the photo, the name and the passport number. Do NOT use the diplomatic passport or the official passport.
- 9. Photocopy of the language proficiency certificate: the transcript or certificate of English language proficiency tests such as TOFEL or GRE etc., which is required of applicants from non-English-speaking countries.
- 10. Two 2-inch bareheaded photos in white background that are taken within 3 months before application.
- 11. Physical Examination Record for Foreigner: the physical examination record which is done within 1 month before application, which proves that the applicant does not carry any serious infectious diseases, the



disability that affects the study, or any entry-forbidden diseases in accordance with the Chinse laws and regulations.

Note: All materials need to be authentic and valid, once the fake materials are found, the admission qualification will be permanently cancelled.

♦ Application for Enrollment

Applicants who meet the above-mentioned requirements need to log into Nanjing Audit University International Students Enrollment System (Website: http://apply.nausie.cucas.cn/). After successful registration, select MAud Program sponsored by MOFCOM from the application interface, follow the operation steps to complete the application process and click submit.

♦ Submission

- 1. The applicants should gain the approval and recommendation of the relevant departments in their home countries before application and submit the application material in accordance with the specific requirements of the departments.
- 2. If the applicants are allowed to submit the application material directly to Chinese Embassy by the relevant departments in their home countries, they should present the approval documents or the recommendation letter. The original copies of documents 1, 2, and 3, together with the scanned copies, should be submitted to Business Department of Chinese Embassy.
- 3. The relevant departments in the applicant's home country should file a written request to Business Department of Chinese Embassy to issue a recommendation letter. The written request should clarify whether the applicants accept reallocation to pursue the same or similar degree in other



universities when the enrollment quota of the intended university is fully occupied. Please clarify here, if you have other special requirements.

Notes:

- (1) All the application documents should be written / printed in English or Chinese, and a notarized translation in English or Chinese should be provided if the original version is not in English or Chinese.
- (2) For important documents such as "Graduation Certificate", "Certificate of Degree", "Academic Transcript", "Language Proficiency Certificate", etc., in addition to the photocopies, the original version should be submitted to Business Department of Chinese Embassy for verification, after which the applicants should scan all the documents and send the softcopy to the contact person of each program undertaker.
- (3) After the verification of Business Department of Chinese Embassy, candidates should retrieve all the paper documents (including the original copies and the photocopies) and keep them safe. When admitted, candidates should bring these documents to China and submit them to designated department of the university for verification, and they will be kept in archives.

iii. Application Deadline

June 6, 2024

The enrollment time is at the beginning of September, 2024. The specific time is subject to the admission notice.

1. General Information

(1) Program Introduction

H) Other fees shall be managed and used by the Ministry of Commerce or the school, and shall not be paid to students. The Ministry of Commerce provides financial assistance only within the academic system. Students who delay graduation for some reason will not receive continued funding.

2. University Information

(1) Introduction to Nankai University

A key multidisciplinary and research-oriented university directly under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Education, Nankai University, locates in Tianjin on the coast of Bohai, near China's capital Beijing, was founded in 1919, and it is one of the most famous universities in China. Nankai University is one of the comprehensive universities with the widest range of disciplines. It features a balance between the humanities and the sciences, a solid foundation and a combination of application and creativity. The university has disciplines such as literature, history, philosophy, economics, management, law, science, engineering, agriculture, medicine, teaching and art.

Nankai University has developed broad international communications by establishing exchange and collaborative relationships with more than 320 international universities and academic institutions. Nankai University will implement the "Global Nankai" strategy. In the need

of State Aid Education, Nankai University relying on its education resources and advantages, combined with computer and software disciplines, is committed to the training of specialists in the field of Computer and Software, thus undertake this program.

(2) Introduction to College of Software

The College of Software was established in 2002, it is one of the first National demonstration Software colleges approved by the Ministry of Education and the State Development Planning Commission. Software Engineering Discipline is the main discipline of our College, after fifteen years of development, it has developed a system of bachelor, master and doctor as complete training system. After many years of accumulation, Software Engineering of Nankai University is in the first group of national key disciplines approved by Chinese government, and being selected as key discipline in Tianjin city.

There are many excellent teachers in College of Software, Nankai University. Their research interesting includes System software, Software Methods and Performance, Parallel Algorithm Design, Software Security Technology, Data Engineering and etc. They undertake multiple National and Ministerial projects, and have published quite amount of high-level papers. Most of our teachers

have oversea research and study experiences, thus they can be very well in English teaching and guidance. Besides, the College has established ties with Research Institutes and Industry, such as establish Joint Research Institute with Chinese Academy of Sciences and Huawei Company, proving practical environment for talent cultivation.

(3) Living Conditions on Campus

Tianjin is located beside Bohai sea, its weather type is continental climate. Its annual average temperature ranges from $11.4 \sim 12.9$ ° C. The coldest time is in January, the average temperature is - 5 \sim 3 ° C; the hottest time is in July, the average temperature is 26 \sim 27 ° C.

This program is based in two campuses: TEDA (Tianjin Economic Development Area) campus and Jinnan campus. Accommodation is arranged according to the actual situation between these two campuses. TEDA campus locates at core center of Binhai district, with flourishing community and complete supporting facilities. Life is convenient with all kinds of financial institutions, hospitals, catering and leisure facility surrounding the campus. Jinnan Campus covers an area of 3688 mu, 15 colleges are located here, we have 5 oversea student apartments with 3 oversea expert apartments. We own 700

dormitories, could accommodate 1000 persons in dining-hall one time.

Single room is provided for each international student. It also equips with TV, air conditioner and furniture, besides, public washing machines are provided. Catering students with different nationalities and various dietary habits, canteens provide delicious food for international students.

The campuses are equipped with badminton court, tennis court and gymnasium; modern library and public library surround the campus. Besides, cable network and wireless network service is provided, Preliminary treatment can be provided in the infirmary in campus.

3. Teaching Arrangements

(1) Course Arrangements

Students must obtain as least 36 credits for graduation, including 21 credits for compulsory courses and 15 credits for optional courses.

(c) Teaching Staff

Teachers of program from The College of Software, The College of Computer, The College of Artificial Intelligence, The College of Economic and The College of Commerce, The College of Chinese Language and Culture, including 24 professors, 42 associate professors and 21 lecturers, most of them have PhD and oversea research or business experiences. Among all the teachers, 47 of them could lead English teaching, 39 of them are qualified supervisor for master program.

(2) Teaching Schema

The program is full-time teaching. Most courses combine theory with practice and can be executed in work. They can be taught with various teaching methods, such as discussion and case analysis, etc.

(3) Class Sessions

Students shall register at Nankai University from September 2024, and finish it within two weeks since registration. Students are supposed to graduate and depart from China before July 2026, in case of completion of obtaining a degree.

(4) Dissertation

(a) Specific Requirements for Graduation Dissertation

The dissertation should reflect that the students have indeed mastered theory and knowledge about software engineering, and have new insights about the latest research topic. In addition, the students should have the ability to do scientific research independently. When all courses are passed, students will continue to prepare their dissertation, specifically, it contains literature survey, thesis proposal, research, experiment execution, theory analysis and writing dissertation. The main body of the dissertation normally no less than 20000 words. When the thesis proposal is passed, students should take no less than one year on the paper work.

(b) Requirement for Oral Defense

No less than five experts (own senior professional technical title) are invited for dissertation appraisal, among of them, at least two of them are experts from industry. The applicant's tutor should not be invited

as paper reviewer. When the paper is sent to paper reviewers, their names should be not revealed, their review opinions must be sealed. Two months before defense date, the paper should be sent to paper reviewers.

Paper defense should be completed within one year, when the applicants pass all the course tests. The Thesis Supervisory Committee consists of at least five experts with senior professional technical title, at least four of them are master tutors, and at least one of them is from industry. Applicant's tutor and referrer should not be invited as members of Thesis Supervisory Committee. The members of the Committee should be approved by Academic Degrees Evaluation Committee.

One month before the defense the paper should be sent to Thesis Supervisory Committee.

(5) Degree-granting

Students will be granted Academic Master's Degree when they obtain 36 credits and pass the dissertation defense which is approved by the Academic Degree Evaluation Committee.

Nankai University shall grant international students the degree certificate uniformly printed by the Office of the Academic Degree Committee of the State Council. The certificate is written in Chinese, and it can be translated into English with a copy.

II. Application Instruction

1. Requirements

All applicants must meet the following requirements:

- (1) Applicants must be non-Chinese citizens with a valid passport, abide by laws and regulations of People's Republic of China and the regulations of Nankai University, and show proper respect for Chinese customs.
- (2) Applicants must be staff from administrations, higher educational institutes, scientific or academic institutions, or non-government organizations in developing counties. Applicants must obtain a Bachelor's degree in Software or relevant majors and with good English proficiency, not older than 45 years old.
- (3) Applicants who are not native English speakers are required to present English Language Proficiency Certificate, language tests such as new TOEFL 80(or better) or IELTS 6 (or better) or other documents which can prove the English proficiency of the applicant shall be submitted; applicants who are English native speakers or university education is completely by English teaching shall not provide language tests.
- (4) The candidates must be healthy and must not have any disease or

situation listed below:

- (a) Diseases prohibited by Chinese Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Laws and Regulations;
- (b) Other severe chronic diseases like high blood pressure, cardiovascular and cerebrovascular diseases, diabetes;
 - (c) Psychological diseases;
- (d) Other infectious diseases which may have a serious impact on public health;
 - (e) In recovery period after major surgery or acute disease attacks;
 - (f) With severe physical disability;
- (g) Pregnant women are not allowed to attend the program. Those who get pregnant while studying in China will be dropped out from school.
- (5) During study in China, applicants should not bring spouse, children, relative or friend;
- (6) Only applicants recommended by the Economic and Commercial Counsellor's Office of Chinese Embassy will be considered.
- (7) Applicants who are already studying in China or have been accepted into other Chinese government scholarship programs will not be admitted.

- a) All the documents to be submitted should be in Chinese or English.Otherwise, a notarized copy in Chinese or English is required.
- b) An original copy of degrees, transcripts and language certificates must be presented for on-site verification.

1. Program Introduction

1.1 Brief Introduction

1.1.1 Program Information

Tsinghua University's Master of Public Administration in International Development and Governance (MIDG) program will begin its students' recruitment of this year. This program is a two-year China MOFCOM English degree program offered by the School of Public Policy and Management (SPPM) at Tsinghua University. China MOFCOM Degree Program is designed to foster high-end officials and managerial personnel for the recipient countries, offering one-year and two-year master programs as well as three-year doctoral programs for the purpose of educating high-end and interdisciplinary talents working in the applied fields of government, trade, foreign affairs, agriculture, technology, education, culture and health, building intellectual capacity and facilitating the economic and social development of the recipient countries. These programs provide assistance to governmental officials, research fellows, and senior managerial personnel for their master and doctor education in China, which are fully conducted in English. Admission requirements include a bachelor's degree, relevant working experiences, and healthy physical conditions, which is essential for the intense study required for the degrees.

As a result of the positive effects brought by these programs in strengthening economic ties and friendship between China and the recipient countries, the Ministry of Commerce of People's Republic of China will continuously intensify its efforts in enlarging the enrollment scale and improving the quality of education. We believe that by attending the programs and achieving the degrees, you will embrace a successful career and brighter future.

Launched in 2015, the Master of Public Administration in International Development

and Governance (MIDG) is designed for professionals engaged in international development and governance in developing countries. By integrating cross-disciplinary knowledge and combining traditional classroom teaching as well as practice, the program aims to help students gain a deep understanding of international development and governance with emphasis of China's development experience, and enhances their analytical and problem-solving abilities by applying public administrative theories and tools. The MIDG program is taught entirely in English and students will be conferred MPA degree upon completion of required credits and thesis defense.

1.1.2 Prospective Students

Our prospective students are mid-to-senior level officials or managers from the government, the media, NGOs, and other public sectors, who have demonstrated superior performance, both academically and in their work. By the time of matriculation, each must have obtained an undergraduate bachelor's degree in the case of our master program and a master's degree in the case of our doctoral program. MIDG program aims to prepare policy makers and practitioners for developing countries. In 2024, Tsinghua University requires students to come to study in China, and all students must comply with the university's regulation and requirements.

1.1.3 Program Highlights

1. Academic Uniqueness

With the integration of SPPM's resources, about 30 English courses are offered in the two-year degree program.

2. Practical Orientation

In order to give students opportunities to gain first-hand experience of integrated development approaches in a real-world context, the MIDG Program enhances the practical training by providing various opportunities of field trips and guest lectures.



3. Global Network

There is an opportunity to learn with young professionals from developing countries and share experience in international development and governance. Students can also gain a better understanding of international development and governance with emphasis of China's development experience

1.1.4 Enrollment Plan

In 2024, Tsinghua University plans to enroll up to 15 students for MIDG program.

1.1.5 Scholarship Coverage

The admitted students will be financially supported by the Chinese Government. The scholarship will cover tuition, accommodation, one-time round trip air tickets and one-time round-trip airfares for home visit during the program (only in summer or winter breaks), insurance, textbook and material fee, field trip and research fee, graduation thesis supervision fee and etc. Students will only receive monthly stipend (RMB 3,000) for 24 months and one-time relocation (RMB 3,000). All other expenses will be managed by MOFCOM and the university together. The sponsorship is only for 2 years. If the student cannot complete the study within the required 2 years, the scholarship is not able to be extended.

The scholarship should refer Chinese Government Scholarship standard for international master degree students and be approved by Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China. All degree students are required to take part in the annual evaluation. Only those who have achieved the standard in the academic performance evaluation can continue to enjoy the scholarship in the next year.



It is not allowed to bring spouse or children to China to accompany the students to study. If a student expects to have his/her spouse, children, relatives or friends to visit him/her during the stay in Beijing, the visitors will have to bear all the expenses by him/herself. MOFCOM and the university are not responsible for taking care of them.


1.2 Introduction of Tsinghua

University

1.2.1 Tsinghua University

Tsinghua University was established in 1911, originally under the name "Tsinghua Xuetang". As one of China's most renowned universities, Tsinghua has become an important institution for fostering talent and scientific research. Moreover, Tsinghua has a long tradition of nurturing public leadership, for instance, both former and current president, Mr. HU Jintao and Mr. XI Jinping are Tsinghua alumni. At present, the university has 22 schools and 59 departments with faculties in science, engineering, humanities, law, medicine, history, philosophy, economics, management, education and art. The University has now over 40,000 students, including over 15,000 undergraduates and over 27,000 graduate students. With the





motto of "Self-Discipline and Social Commitment" and the spirit of "Actions Speak Louder than Words", Tsinghua University is dedicated to the well-being of Chinese society and to world development.

1.2.2 School of Public Policy and Management

The School of Public Policy and Management (SPPM) of Tsinghua University was founded in 2000. As the first graduate school in public administration in China, the School's long-term objective is to become a world-class institution that actively engages in teaching, research, and consulting in global public affairs

Great progress has been made since the School's founding. SPPM has built an

Great progress has been made since the School's founding. SPPM has built an outstanding faculty team and established an excellent MPA program and research-oriented Master. and Ph.D. programs in public management. Since 2007, the school launched seven English taught master programs, namely Master of Public Administration in International Development (MID), International Master of Public Administration (IMPA), Master of Public Policy for Sustainable Development Goals (MPP-SDG), International Master of Public Administration in the Belt and Road Initiative (IMPA-BRI) and International Master of Public Administration for Future Leaders (IMPA-Future Leaders). More than 700 international students have graduated from SPPM, covering more than 110 countries and regions from six continents.

On July 16th, 2013, Tsinghua Master of Public Administration (MPA) program received the Network of Schools of Public Policy, Affairs, and Administration (NASPAA) Accreditation. It is the first MPA program outside the United States to receive NASPAA Accreditation. In 2022, MPA program received the NASPAA Accreditation for the second time.

There are currently more than 60 faculty members at SPPM. Among them, many have earned their doctoral degrees from world-renowned universities. They are actively engaged in researches covering public policies, economics, politics, political economy, international relations, NGO, social/government/industrial innovation, anti-corruption,



development study, crisis management etc.

The research activities in public policy and management in the school have made important contributions to the formulation and implementation of public policies in China. Close partnerships and cooperation have also been forged with international organizations and academic programs in the field of public policy and management around the world.

1.2.3 Life at Beijing and Tsinghua

Life at Beijing

In Beijing, the climate is a typical north temperate and semi humid continental monsoon climate. It is rainy in summer, cold and dry in winter with very short spring and autumn. The annual average temperature is 10-12 degrees. In winter, down jacket is needed. As an international metropolis and China's national political center, Beijing has a long historical tradition and rich cultural heritage. In 2019, the per capita disposable income of Beijing residents is 69434 yuan. The living expense is high in Beijing.

Life at Tsinghua

Tsinghua University provides rooms for MIDG Program students, with each student staying in one room. Each room includes a single bed, a desk, chairs, a wardrobe, an air conditioner, wired and wireless networks, with public bathroom and toilet on each floor. There are more than 10 student dining halls at campus, providing a variety of dishes including Muslim and Western food. Various sports facilities are also provided on campus, including: the Natatorium (swimming and diving), the Comprehensive Gymnasium (badminton, table tennis, basketball, and gymnastics), the West Gymnasium (badminton, basketball, volleyball, and billiards), the West Playground, the East Playground, Zijing Sports Complex (basketball, tennis, volleyball, and soccer), etc. International students can have their own internet accounts and get access to various on-campus internet resources.



1.3 Academic Plan

1.3.1 Curriculum Arrangement

The MIDG program consists of four semesters of full-time academic work, with a minimum course requirement of 37 credits to complete the degree, including compulsory course, 5 credits; compulsory core courses, 9 credits; concentration courses, no less than 6 credits; electives, no less than 9 credits; required components 8 credits. Students must gain all the required credits before the beginning of the fourth semester to be able to join the thesis defense.

1.3.3 Teaching Methods



Thesis Preparation

Students in the program must prepare the thesis under the guidance of his/her advisor and in accordance with the basic requirements for MIDG Thesis. The thesis must be written in English. Students can refer to thesis formatting template provided by the Academic Office. In order to orally defend his/her degree thesis, the student's thesis must meet the format requirement.

Mid-term Review on Thesis Work

MIDG students should complete the mid-term review of the thesis on time in accordance with the notice from the Academic Office. In principle, mid-term review

should be conducted no later than 3 months before the application for thesis defense. After the advisor has reviewed and signed the student's thesis, the assessment team under the International Program Committee will organize a comprehensive review on the progress of thesis work, work attitude, energy investment and other aspects. Those who pass are allowed to continue the thesis work.

Thesis Defense

Students must satisfy all academic requirements of the academic plan and pass all the courses (no failed or incomplete course) in order to apply for oral defense of thesis.

Students defending in the spring semester must submit the final draft (hard copy) of the thesis signed by the advisor before the deadline informed by the Graduate School (thesis defense schedule varies based on academic announcement by the university each year). Tsinghua University Master's degree (graduation) approval material must be submitted with the final draft.

Students must fill out the Tsinghua University Master's Degree (Graduation) Approval Material forms, and sign The Authorization Statement on the use of dissertation and The Statement of Acknowledgements and Declaration prior to leaving school. The student may ask the Academic Office to print the final copies of his/her thesis (signed by the advisor) at the student's own cost.

Students cannot defend the thesis without the advisor's signature. Students who are approved for oral defense must attend the defense in person. The school holds two thesis defenses per year, generally in May and November. The Academic Office will announce the specific time each semester.

Students themselves cover the color-printing fee. After the thesis defense finishes, students are also required to cooperate with Academic Office to submit thesis and complete forms. Students must satisfy all academic requirements of the academic plan

and pass all the courses (no failed or incomplete course) in order to apply for oral defense of thesis.

1.3.5 Graduation and Degree Conferral

Degree to be conferred: Master of Public Administration.

Based on the quality of the thesis and the student's oral defense, the university will make decision to grant a degree, postpone the granting of a degree, or not grant a degree. In the event that the student does not pass the defense, the student will receive a Certificate of Completion. If the student has not met the requirements of the program, or failed the thesis defense, he/she will be granted a Certificate of Incompletion. A certificate from MOFCOM will also be issued upon graduation.

2. Admission

2.1 Qualification of Applicants

- China MOFCOM requires the students to come to study in China from 2023, and students must comply with the regulation and requirements of the university.
- Non Chinese nationals with academic or professional background in the fields of government, NGO, Educational institution, Media, Business etc., and dedicated to work in public sectors.
- 3. Under the age of 45, and with more than 3 years' work experience after undergraduate degree.
- 4. Authenticated Bachelor's degree.
- 5. Good academic background, strong analytic ability, and high English proficiency (for nonnative English speakers: TOEFL 85/IELTS 6.5, or equivalent).
- 6. Good physical and mental health, providing health certificate or physical examination form issued by local public hospitals to prove that have no diseases that violate Chinese laws and regulations prohibiting the entry and prohibition of long-term residency in China.

7. Students who are studying in China or have been admitted to other Chinese government scholarship programs are not allowed to apply.

Only applicants recommended by the Embassy of the People's Republic of China will be considered for admission.



2.3 Required Application Materials

- 1. Passport personal information page (personal and ordinary passport).
- 2. 2-inch photos. One photo should be pasted onto the application form.
- 3. A formal degree certificate of the Bachelor's degree. Applicants are recommended to provide an authentication of the degree diploma provided by the authorities of applicants' home country.
- 4. Academic transcript of your undergraduate study (original or notarized photocopy).
- 5. Resume in English, including personal background, study experience after high school and work experience.



- 7. Two academic recommendation letters from scholars who hold the title of associate professor or higher, or senior professionals in a related academic field. Please follow the instructions on the online system for submission of online recommendation letters or upload the recommendation letters signed by references.
- 8. Photocopies of the English language proficiency test results. For non-native English speakers or applicants whose instruction media of tertiary education is not English, evidence of English proficiency is required. TOEFL 85 or above; IELTS 6.5 or above.
- 9. Foreigner Physical Examination Form. The examination result must be obtained within month. All applicants shall be in good physical conditions and carry no infectious diseases which may have a serious impact on public health or fall into any of the health situations prohibited by China's Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Laws and Regulations.
- 10. Non-Criminal Record Report, within 6 months of application.

The documents provided should be the original documents in Chinese or in English; otherwise notarized translations in Chinese or English are required.

2.4 Embassy Recommendation

Only after students have obtained the approval from their government ministries, can they apply for this program, and submit all the application materials to the Economic and Commercial Counsellor's Office, Embassy of the People's Republic of China. The ministries should clarify with the embassy about whether the applicant is willing to be considered for other university or other master program if the MIDG program is



already full.

If the ministries of students' home country permit individual student to submit materials directly to Embassy of the People's Republic of China in their own country, the students should acquire certificates or recommendation from the ministries and submit the documents to the Economic and Commercial Counsellor's Office, Embassy of the People's Republic of China.

Once the university receives the Embassy's official recommendation letter, the candidate will get into the academic review round.

2.5 Application Remarks

- Applicants are required to submit scanned images of all required documents at
 the time of application. All uploaded documents should be in Chinese or in
 English; otherwise notarial translations in Chinese or English are required. Once
 translated, the original documents and certified translations should be submitted
 together to the application system.
- Please scan the original or notarized application documents in color using a scanner. Images captured by mobile phone or camera are not acceptable. Scans of copies are also not acceptable.
- Applications with incomplete documents will not be processed. Applicants should
 take the initiative to understand the application procedures and application
 requirements before applying. The applicant will be responsible for any
 consequences arising from failure to complete the application process as required.
- THU has the right to require applicants to provide original/notarized copies of application materials or certification documents issued by a designated certification body for further inspection.

1. Program Introduction

1.1 Brief Introduction

1.1.1 Program Information

Tsinghua University's Master of Public Administration in International Development and Governance (MIDG) program will begin its students' recruitment of this year. This program is a two-year China MOFCOM English degree program offered by the School of Public Policy and Management (SPPM) at Tsinghua University. China MOFCOM Degree Program is designed to foster high-end officials and managerial personnel for the recipient countries, offering one-year and two-year master programs as well as three-year doctoral programs for the purpose of educating high-end and interdisciplinary talents working in the applied fields of government, trade, foreign affairs, agriculture, technology, education, culture and health, building intellectual capacity and facilitating the economic and social development of the recipient countries. These programs provide assistance to governmental officials, research fellows, and senior managerial personnel for their master and doctor education in China, which are fully conducted in English. Admission requirements include a bachelor's degree, relevant working experiences, and healthy physical conditions, which is essential for the intense study required for the degrees.

As a result of the positive effects brought by these programs in strengthening economic ties and friendship between China and the recipient countries, the Ministry of Commerce of People's Republic of China will continuously intensify its efforts in enlarging the enrollment scale and improving the quality of education. We believe that by attending the programs and achieving the degrees, you will embrace a successful career and brighter future.

Launched in 2015, the Master of Public Administration in International Development and Governance (MIDG) is designed for professionals engaged in international

development and governance in developing countries. By integrating cross-disciplinary knowledge and combining traditional classroom teaching as well as practice, the program aims to help students gain a deep understanding of international development and governance with emphasis of China's development experience, and enhances their analytical and problem-solving abilities by applying public administrative theories and tools. The MIDG program is taught entirely in English and students will be conferred MPA degree upon completion of required credits and thesis defense.

1.1.2 Prospective Students

Our prospective students are mid-to-senior level officials or managers from the government, the media, NGOs, and other public sectors, who have demonstrated superior performance, both academically and in their work. By the time of matriculation, each must have obtained an undergraduate bachelor's degree in the case of our master program and a master's degree in the case of our doctoral program. MIDG program aims to prepare policy makers and practitioners for developing countries. In 2024, Tsinghua University requires students to come to study in China, and all students must comply with the university's regulation and requirements.

1.1.3 Program Highlights

1. Academic Uniqueness

With the integration of SPPM's resources, about 30 English courses are offered in the two-year degree program.

2. Practical Orientation

In order to give students opportunities to gain first-hand experience of integrated development approaches in a real-world context, the MIDG Program enhances the practical training by providing various opportunities of field trips and guest lectures.

3. Global Network

There is an opportunity to learn with young professionals from developing countries and share experience in international development and governance. Students can also gain a better understanding of international development and governance with emphasis



of China's development experience

1.1.4 Enrollment Plan

In 2024, Tsinghua University plans to enroll up to 15 students for MIDG program.

1.1.5 Scholarship Coverage

The admitted students will be financially supported by the Chinese Government. The scholarship will cover tuition, accommodation, one-time round trip air tickets and one-time round-trip airfares for home visit during the program (only in summer or winter breaks), insurance, textbook and material fee, field trip and research fee, graduation thesis supervision fee and etc. Students will only receive monthly stipend (RMB 3,000) for 24 months and one-time relocation (RMB 3,000). All other expenses will be managed by MOFCOM and the university together. The sponsorship is only for 2 years. If the student cannot complete the study within the required 2 years, the scholarship is not able to be extended.

The scholarship should refer Chinese Government Scholarship standard for international master degree students and be approved by Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China. All degree students are required to take part in the annual evaluation. Only those who have achieved the standard in the academic performance evaluation can continue to enjoy the scholarship in the next year.

It is not allowed to bring spouse or children to China to accompany the students to study. If a student expects to have his/her spouse, children, relatives or friends to visit him/her during the stay in Beijing, the visitors will have to bear all the expenses by him/herself. MOFCOM and the university are not responsible for taking care of them.







1.2 Introduction of Tsinghua University

1.2.1 Tsinghua University


Tsinghua University was established in 1911, originally under the name "Tsinghua Xuetang". As one of China's most renowned universities, Tsinghua has become an important institution for fostering talent and scientific research. Moreover, Tsinghua has a long tradition of nurturing public leadership, for instance, both former and current president, Mr. HU Jintao and Mr. XI Jinping are Tsinghua alumni. At present, the

university has 22 schools and 59 departments with faculties in science, engineering, humanities, law, medicine, history, philosophy, economics, management, education and art. The University has now over 40,000 students, including over 15,000 undergraduates and over 27,000 graduate students. With the motto of "Self-Discipline and Social Commitment" and the spirit of "Actions Speak Louder than Words", Tsinghua University is dedicated to the well-being of Chinese society and to world development.

1.2.2 School of Public Policy and

Management

The School of Public Policy and Management (SPPM) of Tsinghua University was founded in 2000. As the first graduate school in public administration in China, the School's long-term objective is to become a world-class institution



that actively engages in teaching, research, and consulting in global public affairs

Great progress has been made since the School's founding. SPPM has built an outstanding faculty team and established an excellent MPA program and researchoriented Master. and Ph.D. programs in public management. Since 2007, the school

launched seven English taught master programs, namely Master of Public Administration in International Development (MID), International Master of Public Administration (IMPA), Master of Public Policy for Sustainable Development Goals (MPP-SDG), International Master of Public Administration in the Belt and Road Initiative (IMPA-BRI) and International Master of Public Administration for Future Leaders (IMPA-Future Leaders). More than 700 international students have graduated from SPPM, covering more than 110 countries and regions from six continents.

On July 16th, 2013, Tsinghua Master of Public Administration (MPA) program received the Network of Schools of Public Policy, Affairs, and Administration (NASPAA) Accreditation. It is the first MPA program outside the United States to receive NASPAA Accreditation. In 2022, MPA program received the NASPAA Accreditation for the second time.

There are currently more than 60 faculty members at SPPM. Among them, many have earned their doctoral degrees from world-renowned universities. They are actively engaged in researches covering public policies, economics, politics, political economy, international relations, NGO, social/government/industrial innovation, anti-corruption, development study, crisis management etc.

The research activities in public policy and management in the school have made important contributions to the formulation and implementation of public policies in China. Close partnerships and cooperation have also been forged with international organizations and academic programs in the field of public policy and management around the world.

1.2.3 Life at Beijing and Tsinghua

Life at Beijing

In Beijing, the climate is a typical north temperate and semi humid continental monsoon climate. It is rainy in summer, cold and dry in winter with very short spring and autumn. The annual average temperature is 10-12 degrees. In winter, down jacket is needed. As

an international metropolis and China's national political center, Beijing has a long historical tradition and rich cultural heritage. In 2019, the per capita disposable income of Beijing residents is 69434 yuan. The living expense is high in Beijing.

Life at Tsinghua

Tsinghua University provides rooms for MIDG Program students, with each student staying in one room. Each room includes a single bed, a desk, chairs, a wardrobe, an air conditioner, wired and wireless networks, with public bathroom and toilet on each floor. There are more than 10 student dining halls at campus, providing a variety of dishes including Muslim and Western food. Various sports facilities are also provided on campus, including: the Natatorium (swimming and diving), the Comprehensive Gymnasium (badminton, table tennis, basketball, and gymnastics), the West Gymnasium (badminton, basketball, volleyball, and billiards), the West Playground, the East Playground, Zijing Sports Complex (basketball, tennis, volleyball, and soccer), etc. International students can have their own internet accounts and get access to various on-campus internet resources.

1.3 Academic Plan

1.3.1 Curriculum Arrangement

The MIDG program consists of four semesters of full-time academic work, with a minimum course requirement of 37 credits to complete the degree, including compulsory course, 5 credits; compulsory core courses, 9 credits; concentration courses, no less than 6 credits; electives, no less than 9 credits; required components 8 credits.

Students must gain all the required credits before the beginning of the fourth semester to be able to join the thesis defense.

1.3.3 Teaching Methods

The program introduces to the students the major concepts, theories and practices of public management. It will also help students access and understand the practices of Chinese public administration in the reform era. To achieve this purpose, instructors will adopt various teaching methods, including lecturing, case discussion, group presentations and on-site visits. Students are expected to actively participate in the teaching process and contribute to the classroom discussion.

1.3.4 Graduation Thesis

Thesis Proposal

Prior to thesis preparation, students must determine a thesis topic after consulting with his/her advisor, and submit the Thesis Proposal Report and Schedule of Thesis Writing of Master's Candidates of Tsinghua University along with a hard copy of the proposal signed by the advisor to the Academic Office. In case the thesis proposal is not approved, the student must consult with his/her advisor and submit a revised proposal. According to the requirements for graduate innovative achievements, the advisor should conduct a comprehensive evaluation of students' topic selection, sign and give comments on the thesis proposal form. Student whose thesis proposal is concluded as "failed" should revise their proposal work within 1-3 months and resubmit thesis proposal the second time. Student whose second thesis proposal result is concluded as "failed" should revise their proposal work again within 1-3 months and resubmit thesis proposal the third time. In the third review. If students' thesis proposal still cannot pass, thesis work will be assessed as "not meet the requirements of program study". In this case, graduate student should apply for withdrawal, otherwise will be expelled from Tsinghua University.

After the thesis proposal has been approved, students will receive 1 credit for Literature Review and Thesis Proposal course. It is recommended that students spend no less than six months on thesis writing after the thesis proposal submission.



Thesis Preparation

Students in the program must prepare the thesis under the guidance of his/her advisor and in accordance with the basic requirements for MIDG Thesis. The thesis must be written in English. Students can refer to thesis formatting template provided by the Academic Office. In order to orally defend his/her degree thesis, the student's thesis must meet the format requirement.

Mid-term Review on Thesis Work

MIDG students should complete the mid-term review of the thesis on time in accordance with the notice from the Academic Office. In principle, mid-term review should be conducted no later than 3 months before the application for thesis defense. After the advisor has reviewed and signed the student's thesis, the assessment team under the International Program Committee will organize a comprehensive review on the progress of thesis work, work attitude, energy investment and other aspects. Those who pass are allowed to continue the thesis work.

Thesis Defense

Students must satisfy all academic requirements of the academic plan and pass all the courses (no failed or incomplete course) in order to apply for oral defense of thesis.

Students defending in the spring semester must submit the final draft (hard copy) of the thesis signed by the advisor before the deadline informed by the Graduate School (thesis defense schedule varies based on academic announcement by the university each year). Tsinghua University Master's degree (graduation) approval material must be submitted with the final draft.

Students must fill out the Tsinghua University Master's Degree (Graduation) Approval Material forms, and sign The Authorization Statement on the use of dissertation and The Statement of Acknowledgements and Declaration prior to leaving school. The student may ask the Academic Office to print the final copies of his/her thesis (signed

Students cannot defend the thesis without the advisor's signature. Students who are

approved for oral defense must attend the defense in person. The school holds two thesis

defenses per year, generally in May and November. The Academic Office will

announce the specific time each semester.

Students themselves cover the color-printing fee. After the thesis defense finishes,

students are also required to cooperate with Academic Office to submit thesis and

complete forms. Students must satisfy all academic requirements of the academic plan

1.3.5 Graduation and Degree Conferral

Degree to be conferred: Master of Public Administration.

Based on the quality of the thesis and the student's oral defense, the university will

make decision to grant a degree, postpone the granting of a degree, or not grant a degree.

In the event that the student does not pass the defense, the student will receive a

Certificate of Completion. If the student has not met the requirements of the program,

or failed the thesis defense, he/she will be granted a Certificate of Incompletion. A

certificate from MOFCOM will also be issued upon graduation.

2.1 Qualification of Applicants

1. China MOFCOM requires the students to come to study in China from 2023,

and students must comply with the regulation and requirements of the

university.

2. Non Chinese nationals with academic or professional background in the fields of

- government, NGO, Educational institution, Media, Business etc., and dedicated to work in public sectors.
- 3. Under the age of 45, and with more than 3 years' work experience after undergraduate degree.
- 4. Authenticated Bachelor's degree.
- 5. Good academic background, strong analytic ability, and high English proficiency (for nonnative English speakers: TOEFL 85/IELTS 6.5, or equivalent).
- 6. Good physical and mental health, providing health certificate or physical examination form issued by local public hospitals to prove that have no diseases that violate Chinese laws and regulations prohibiting the entry and prohibition of long-term residency in China.
- 7. Students who are studying in China or have been admitted to other Chinese government scholarship programs are not allowed to apply.
- 8. With the potential of career development in this field and with the intention to promote friendly exchanges and cooperation between China and the host country.

Only applicants recommended by the Embassy of the People's Republic of China will be considered for admission.

2.3 Required Application Materials

- 2. 2-inch photos. One photo should be pasted onto the application form.
- A formal degree certificate of the Bachelor's degree. Applicants are recommended
 to provide an authentication of the degree diploma provided by the authorities of
 applicants' home country.
- 4. Academic transcript of your undergraduate study (original or notarized photocopy).
- 5. Resume in English, including personal background, study experience after high school and work experience.
- 6. Personal statement. The personal statement should be completed directly in the application system. Please indicate the motivation for applying the MIDG program of Tsinghua University, the advantages and accomplishment after fulfilling the program, the study plan and the career goal.
- 7. Two academic recommendation letters from scholars who hold the title of associate professor or higher, or senior professionals in a related academic field. Please follow the instructions on the online system for submission of online recommendation letters or upload the recommendation letters signed by references.
- 8. Photocopies of the English language proficiency test results. For non-native English speakers or applicants whose instruction media of tertiary education is not English, evidence of English proficiency is required. TOEFL 85 or above; IELTS 6.5 or above.
- 9. Foreigner Physical Examination Form. The examination result must be obtained within month. All applicants shall be in good physical conditions and carry no infectious diseases which may have a serious impact on public health or fall into any of the health situations prohibited by China's Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Laws and Regulations.

2.4 Embassy Recommendation

Only after students have obtained the approval from their government ministries, can they apply for this program, and submit all the application materials to the Economic and Commercial Counsellor's Office, Embassy of the People's Republic of China. The ministries should clarify with the embassy about whether the applicant is willing to be considered for other university or other master program if the MIDG program is already full.

If the ministries of students' home country permit individual student to submit materials directly to Embassy of the People's Republic of China in their own country, the students should acquire certificates or recommendation from the ministries and submit the documents to the Economic and Commercial Counsellor's Office, Embassy of the People's Republic of China.

Once the university receives the Embassy's official recommendation letter, the candidate will get into the academic review round.

2.5 Application Remarks

- Applicants are required to submit scanned images of all required documents at the
 time of application. All uploaded documents should be in Chinese or in English;
 otherwise notarial translations in Chinese or English are required. Once translated,
 the original documents and certified translations should be submitted together to
 the application system.
- Please scan the original or notarized application documents in color using a scanner.
 Images captured by mobile phone or camera are not acceptable. Scans of copies are also not acceptable.

1. PROGRAM INTRODUCTION

(1)Program Description

Degree Education Programs starting from 2008, sponsored by the Ministry of Commerce of People's Republic of China is designed to foster high-end business officials and managerial personnel for the recipient countries, offering one-year and two-year master programs as well as three-year doctoral programs for the purpose of educating high-end and inter-disciplinary talent



working in the applied fields of government, trade, foreign affairs, agriculture, technology, education, culture and health, building intellectual capacity and facilitating the economic and social development of the recipient countries. These programs provide assistance to governmental officials, research fellows, and senior managerial personnel on their master and doctor education in China, which are fully conducted in English. Admission requirements include a bachelor's degree, relevant working experiences, and decent physical conditions, essential for the high-compact curriculum needed for the degrees.

This program is playing an increasingly important role in the economic and trade cooperation and development between student's country and China, and is highly valued by his/her government.

Teaching mode

It is the combination of classroom instruction, seminar, lab experiments, field trips and thesis. School of Environmental Science and Engineering boasts of first-class faculty composed of distinguished scholars and accomplished practitioners, who have been actively engaged in study of China's environmental protection practices and policy issues, and widely acknowledged as experts in their own field.

Field trips will be arranged for students to visit government agencies, special economic zones, business corporations and environmental protection facilities etc., to gain first-hand knowledge of how governments and markets operate under various changing conditions in the reform and opening-up process of China, in environmental protection. Students have to submit a report after each field trip.

Term arrangement

There are two semesters, spring and autumn, in one academic year. In general, the spring term will start from Feb. 20th to Jul. 10th, while the autumn term will start from Sept. 1st to Jan. 20th . Jul. 11th to Aug. 31 and Jan. 21st to Feb. 19th are summer and winter vacation, respectively. It carries out according to the university calender in practice.

Thesis for graduate

Students are expected to bring specific research questions concerning environmental science and engineering to the program, as a part of thesis research preparation. With the guidance of a supervisor, a student is expected to carry out independent research that combine theoretical perspectives, analytic skills and practical experiences of environmental science and engineering, and aiming at solving practical problems.

A student shall choose a professor as his/her supervisor by the end of the first semester, and joins in the professor's research team to study and practice. At the end of second semester, he/she should determine his/her research topic with the guidance and discuss with supervisor. In the third and fourth semester, he/she have to collect data, conduct research, and write the dissertation. During the course of research and writing, students are expected to interact regularly with their academic supervisors. In the fourth semester,

they shall finalize and defend their dissertations.

Thesis or dissertation shall be written in English with 20,000 words.

Students must pass the oral defense for their thesis.

Degrees Award

A master degree of Environmental Science and Engineering will be conferred upon a candidate in the master program after his/her successful completion of required credits and thesis.









2. APPLICATION

(1) REQUIREMENT

All applicants must meet the following admission requirements:

- 1) Applicants must be non-Chinese citizens from developing countries, with a valid passport, or any other identification certificate sufficient to verify his/her nationality; All applicants should be younger than 45 years
- old. (born after 1st September, 1979)
- 2) All applicants should be in good health with health certificate issued by the local public hospitals; without diseases with which entry to China is

disallowed by China's lows and regulations; without severe chronic diseases such as serious high blood pressure, cardiovascular/cerebrovascular diseases and diabetes; without metal diseases or epidemic diseases that are likely to cause serious threat to public health; not in the process of recovering after a major operation or in the process of acute diseases; not seriously disabled or pregnant. If students get pregnant during studying period in China, she will be expelled from school.

- 3) Applicants for the master program must have attained a Bachelor degree and with at least 2 years working experience are preferred.
- 4) Applicants with professional study or work background which is related to the program are preferred
- 5) Applicants who work in government organizations, related companies, universities, Scientific research institutions are preferred.
- 6) Applicants must be proficient in English; Applicants who are not native English speakers or whose undergraduate education was not conducted in English shall provide the certificate of English language proficiency.
- 7) Applicants should have the potential of career development in this field and intend to promote the friendly exchanges and cooperation between the host country and China.
- 8) Applicants must be recommended by the Economic and Commercial Counselor Office of Chinese Embassy in the country that accords with the candidate's nationality.

(2) SUBMISSION

Materials

Before submitting the application, you have to prepare the materials listed in table 1.

- a) Submit all hard copy and e-copy to the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Office of Chinese Embassy. Hard copy must include both original copy and photocopy. For email and addresses of the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Offices, please visit http://www.china-aibo.cn.
- b) Submit a written application to the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Office of Chinese Embassy for an official recommendation letter and clearly state:

Whether the applicant is willing to be considered for a similar program at other universities if the positions of program at USTS are already full.

Other special requests if any.

Reminders:

- a) All the documents to be submitted should be in Chinese or English. Otherwise, a notarized copy in Chinese or English is required.
- b) An original copy of degrees, transcripts and other documents must be presented for on-site verification.
- c) Applicants will get back all the hard-copy materials, both original copies and photocopies from the Economic and Commercial Counselor's Office. If admitted, you must take the documents to China and submit them to the School of Environmental Science and Engineering during registration in September. In this case, the original copy must be presented for on-site verification.
